A BILL

To amend the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to enhance the use of Juvenile Accountability Block Grants for programs to prevent and address occurrences of bullying and to reauthorize the Juvenile Accountability Block Grants program.

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Juvenile Accountability
3 Block Grant Reauthorization Act of 2012”.

4 **SEC. 2. REAUTHORIZATION OF JUVENILE ACCOUNTABILITY**

5 **BLOCK GRANTS.**

6 Section 1810(a) of the Omnibus Crime Control and
7 Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3796ee–10(a)) is
8 amended by inserting before the period at the end the fol-
9 lowing: “and \$40,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2014
10 through 2018”.

 Amend the title so as to read: “A bill to amend the
Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to
enhance the use of Juvenile Accountability Block
Grants.”.
