Stafford Disaster 13 Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et

seq.) due to Hurricane Sandy and other eligible events in 14 15 calendar years 2011, 2012, and 2013, for activities authorized under title I of the Housing and Community De-16 velopment Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. 5301 et seq.): Provided, 17 18 That funds shall be awarded directly to the State or unit of general local government as a grantee at the discretion 19 20 of the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development: Pro-21 *vided further*, That the Secretary shall allocate to grantees 22 not less than 33 percent of the funds provided under this 23 heading within 60 days after the enactment of this Act 24 based on the best available data: Provided further, That 25 prior to the obligation of funds, a grantee shall submit

a plan to the Secretary for approval detailing the proposed 1 use of all funds, including criteria for eligibility and how 2 3 the use of these funds will address long-term recovery and 4 restoration of infrastructure and housing and economic re-5 vitalization in the most impacted and distressed areas: *Provided further*, That the Secretary shall by notice specify 6 7 the criteria for approval of such plans within 45 days of 8 enactment of this Act: Provided further, That if the Sec-9 retary determines that a plan does not meet such criteria, 10 the Secretary shall disapprove the plan: *Provided further*, 11 That funds provided under this heading may not be used 12 for activities reimbursable by or for which funds are made 13 available by the Federal Emergency Management Agency or the Army Corps of Engineers: *Provided further*, That 14 15 funds allocated under this heading shall not be considered relevant to the non-disaster formula allocations made pur-16 suant to section 106 of the Housing and Community De-17 velopment Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. 5306): Provided further, 18 19 That a grantee may use up to 5 percent of its allocation for administrative costs: *Provided further*, That a grantee 20 21 shall administer grant funds provided under this heading 22 in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations and 23 may not delegate, by contract or otherwise, the responsi-24 bility for administering such grant funds: *Provided further*, 25 That as a condition of making any grant, the Secretary

shall certify in advance that such grantee has in place pro-1 2 ficient financial controls and procurement processes and 3 has established adequate procedures to prevent any dupli-4 cation of benefits as defined by section 312 of the Robert 5 T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5155), to ensure timely expenditure of funds, 6 7 to maintain comprehensive websites regarding all disaster 8 recovery activities assisted with these funds, and to detect 9 and prevent waste, fraud, and abuse of funds: Provided 10 *further*, That the Secretary shall provide grantees with technical assistance on contracting and procurement proc-11 esses and shall require grantees, in contracting or pro-12 13 curing these funds, to incorporate performance requirements and penalties into any such contracts or agree-14 15 ments: *Provided further*, That the Secretary shall require grantees to maintain on a public website information ac-16 17 counting for how all grant funds are used, including de-18 tails of all contracts and ongoing procurement processes: *Provided further*, That, in administering the funds under 19 this heading, the Secretary may waive, or specify alter-20 21 native requirements for, any provision of any statute or 22 regulation that the Secretary administers in connection 23 with the obligation by the Secretary or the use by the re-24 cipient of these funds (except for requirements related to 25 fair housing, nondiscrimination, labor standards, and the

environment) pursuant to a determination by the Sec-1 2 retary that good cause exists for the waiver or alternative 3 requirement and that such action is not inconsistent with 4 the overall purposes of title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. 5301 et seq.): 5 *Provided further*, That, notwithstanding the preceding pro-6 viso, recipients of funds provided under this heading that 7 8 use such funds to supplement Federal assistance provided 9 under sections 402, 403, 406, 407, or 502 of the Robert 10 T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.) may adopt, without review or 11 12 public comment, any environmental review, approval, or 13 permit performed by a Federal agency, and such adoption 14 shall satisfy the responsibilities of the recipient with re-15 spect to such environmental review, approval or permit: *Provided further*, That, notwithstanding section 104(g)(2)16 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1974 (42) 17 U.S.C. 5304(g)(2)), the Secretary may, upon receipt of 18 19 a request for release of funds and certification, imme-20 diately approve the release of funds for an activity or 21 project assisted under this heading if the recipient has 22 adopted an environmental review, approval or permit 23 under the preceding proviso or the activity or project is 24 categorically excluded from review under the National En-25 vironmental Policy Act of 1969 (42 U.S.C. 4321 et seq.):

Provided further, That a waiver granted by the Secretary 1 may not reduce the percentage of funds that must be used 2 3 for activities that benefit persons of low and moderate in-4 come to less than 50 percent, unless the Secretary specifically finds that there is a compelling need to further re-5 duce or eliminate the percentage requirement: *Provided* 6 7 *further*, That the Secretary shall publish in the Federal 8 Register any waiver of any statute or regulation that the 9 Secretary administers pursuant to title I of the Housing 10 and Community Development Act of 1974 no later than 5 days before the effective date of such waiver: *Provided* 11 *further*, That, of the funds made available under this head-12 13 ing, up to \$10,000,000 may be transferred to "Program Office Salaries and Expenses, Community Planning and 14 15 Development" for necessary costs, including information technology costs, of administering and overseeing funds 16 made available under this heading: *Provided further*, That 17 18 of the funds made available under this heading, 19 \$10,000,000 shall be transferred to "Office of the Inspector General" for necessary costs of overseeing and audit-20 21 ing funds made available under this heading: Provided fur-22 ther, That the amounts provided under this heading are 23 designated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-24 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal-25 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS TITLE

2 SEC. 1001. For fiscal year 2013, upon request by a 3 public housing agency and supported by documentation as 4 required by the Secretary of Housing and Urban Develop-5 ment that demonstrates that the need for the adjustment is due to the disaster, the Secretary may make temporary 6 7 adjustments to the section 8 housing choice voucher an-8 nual renewal funding allocations and administrative fee 9 eligibility determinations for public housing agencies in an 10 area for which the President declared a disaster during such fiscal year under title IV of the Robert T. Stafford 11 12 Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 13 5170 et seq.), to avoid significant adverse funding impacts that would otherwise result from the disaster. 14

15 SEC. 1002. The Departments of Transportation and 16 Housing and Urban Development shall submit to the 17 Committees on Appropriations of the House of Rep-18 resentatives and the Senate within 45 days after the date 19 of the enactment of this Act a plan for implementing the 20 provisions in this title, and updates to such plan on a bian-21 nual basis thereafter.

SEC. 1003. None of the funds provided in this title
to the Department of Transportation or the Department
of Housing and Urban Development may be used to make
a grant unless the Secretary of such Department notifies

the Committees on Appropriations of the House of Rep resentatives and the Senate not less than 3 full business
 days before any project, State or locality is selected to re ceive a grant award totaling \$1,000,000 or more is an nounced by either Department or a modal administration.
