10 For an additional amount for "Investigations" for necessary expenses related to the consequences of Hurri-11 12 cane Sandy, \$20,000,000, to remain available until ex-13 pended to conduct studies of flood and storm damage reduction related to natural disasters: *Provided*, That using 14 15 \$19,500,000 of the funds provided herein, the Secretary of the Army shall conduct, at full Federal expense, a com-16 prehensive study to address the flood risks of vulnerable 17 coastal populations in areas impacted by Hurricane Sandy 18 within the boundaries of the North Atlantic Division of 19 the United States Army Corps of Engineers: Provided fur-20 21 ther, That an interim report with an assessment of author-22 ized Corps projects for reducing flooding and storm risks 23 in the affected area that have been constructed or are 24 under construction, including construction cost estimates, shall be submitted to the Committees on Appropriations 25

of the House of Representatives and the Senate not later 1 than March 1, 2013: Provided further, That an interim 2 report 3 identifying any previously authorized but 4 unconstructed Corps project and any project under study by the Corps for reducing flooding and storm damage 5 risks in the affected area, including updated construction 6 7 cost estimates, that are, or would be, consistent with the 8 comprehensive study shall be submitted to the appropriate 9 congressional committees not later than May 1, 2013: Pro-10 *vided further*, That a final report shall be submitted to the appropriate congressional committees not later than 11 12 24 months after the date of enactment of this Act: Pro-13 *vided further*. For the "Public Transportation Emergency Relief Program" as authorized under section 5324 of title 49, United States Code, \$5,400,000,000, to remain available until expended, for transit systems affected by Hurricane Sandy: *Provided*, That not more than \$2,000,000,000 shall be made available not later than 60 days after the

date of enactment of this Act: *Provided further*, That the 1 remainder of the funds shall be made available only after 2 the Federal Transit Administration and the Federal 3 4 Emergency Management Agency sign the memorandum of agreement required by section 20017(b) of the Moving 5 6 Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (Public Law 7 112–141) and the Federal Transit Administration pub-8 lishes interim regulations for the Public Transportation 9 Emergency Relief Program: *Provided further*, That not more than three-quarters of 1 percent of the funds for 10 public transportation emergency relief shall be available 11 for administrative expenses and ongoing program manage-12 ment oversight as authorized under 49 U.S.C. 5334 and 13 5338(i)(2) and shall be in addition to any other appropria-14 15 tions for such purpose: *Provided further*, That of the funds made available under this heading, \$3,000,000 shall be 16 transferred to the Office of Inspector General to support 17 18 the oversight of activities under this heading: *Provided further*, That such amounts are designated by the Con-19 20 gress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to 21 section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and 22 Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

  - HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT

5 SEC. 801. For fiscal year 2013, upon request by a public housing agency and supported by documentation as 6 7 required by the Secretary of Housing and Urban Develop-8 ment that demonstrates that the need for the adjustment 9 is due to the disaster, the Secretary may make temporary 10 adjustments to the Section 8 housing choice voucher annual renewal funding allocations and administrative fee 11 12 eligibility determinations for public housing agencies in an area for which the President declared a disaster under 13 title IV of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and 14 15 Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5170 et seq.), to avoid significant adverse funding impacts that would oth-16 17 erwise result from the disaster.

18 TITLE IX

19 GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS ACT

SEC. 901. Each amount appropriated or made available in this Act is in addition to amounts otherwise appropriated for the fiscal year involved.

SEC. 902. Each amount designated in this Act by the
Congress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant
to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and

Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 shall be available
 only if the President subsequently so designates all such
 amounts and transmits such designations to the Congress.
 SEC. 903. No part of any appropriation contained in
 this Act shall remain available for obligation beyond the
 current fiscal year unless expressly so provided herein.

7 SEC. 904. (a)(1) Not later than March 31, 2013, in 8 accordance with criteria to be established by the Director 9 of the Office of Management and Budget (referred to in this section as "OMB"), each Federal agency shall submit 10 to OMB, the Government Accountability Office, the re-11 12 spective Inspector General of each agency, and the Com-13 mittees on Appropriations of the House of Representatives and the Senate internal control plans for funds provided 14 15 by this Act.

16 (2) Not later than June 30, 2013, the Government
17 Accountability Office shall review for the Committees on
18 Appropriations of the House of Representatives and the
19 Senate the design of the internal control plans required
20 by paragraph (1).

(b) All programs and activities receiving funds under
this Act shall be deemed to be "susceptible to significant
improper payments" for purposes of the Improper Payments Information Act of 2002 (31 U.S.C. 3321 note),
notwithstanding section 2(a) of such Act.

1 (c) Funds for grants provided by this Act shall be 2 expended by the grantees within the 24-month period fol-3 lowing the agency's obligation of funds for the grant, un-4 less, in accordance with guidance to be issued by the Di-5 rector of OMB, the Director waives this requirement for a particular grant program and submits a written jus-6 7 tification for such waiver to the Committees on Appropria-8 tions of the House of Representatives and the Senate. In 9 the case of such grants, the agency shall include a term 10 in the grant that requires the grantee to return to the agency any funds not expended within the 24-month pe-11 12 riod.

13 (d) Through September 30, 2015, the Recovery Ac-14 countability and Transparency Board shall develop and 15 use information technology resources and oversight mechanisms to detect and remediate waste, fraud, and abuse 16 in the obligation and expenditure of funds appropriated 17 in this or any other Act for any fiscal year of such period 18 for purposes related to the impact of Hurricane Sandy: 19 *Provided*, That the Board shall coordinate its oversight ef-20 21 forts with the Director of OMB, the head of each Federal 22 agency receiving appropriations related to the impact of 23 Hurricane Sandy, and the respective Inspector General of 24 each such agency: *Provided further*, That the Board shall submit quarterly reports to the Committees on Appropria-25

1 tions of the House of Representatives and the Senate on

2 its activities related to funds appropriated for the impact

3 of Hurricane Sandy.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Disaster Relief Appro-

5 priations Act, 2013".

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
