Providing for the expenses of certain committees of the House of Representatives in the One Hundred Thirteenth Congress.

1 Resolved,

2 SECTION 1. COMMITTEE EXPENSES FOR THE ONE HUN-

3 DRED THIRTEENTH CONGRESS.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—With respect to the One Hundred

5 Thirteenth Congress, there shall be paid out of the appli-

6 cable accounts of the House of Representatives, in accord-

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ance with this primary expense resolution, not more than
 the amount specified in subsection (b) for the expenses
 (including the expenses of all staff salaries) of each com mittee named in such subsection.

(2) WAIVER.—The Committee on House Administration may waive the application of paragraph
(1) to any or all of the committees named in subsection (b).

23 SEC. 4. VOUCHERS.

24 Payments under this resolution shall be made on25 vouchers authorized by the committee involved, signed by

the chairman of such committee, and approved in the
 manner directed by the Committee on House Administra tion.

4 SEC. 5. REGULATIONS.

5 Amounts made available under this resolution shall6 be expended in accordance with regulations prescribed by7 the Committee on House Administration.

8 SEC. 6. RESERVE FUND FOR UNANTICIPATED EXPENSES.

9 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is hereby established a
10 reserve fund for unanticipated expenses of committees for
11 the One Hundred Thirteenth Congress.

12 (b) BALANCE.—The balance of the reserve fund13 under this section shall be equal to the sum of the fol-14 lowing:

15 (1) The amount by which the amount made 16 available for "House of Representatives—Committee 17 Employees, Standing Committees, Special and Se-18 lect" for fiscal year 2013 exceeds the amount that 19 would be made available for "House of Representa-20 tives—Committee Employees, Standing Committees, 21 Special and Select" by division C of the Department 22 of Defense, Military Construction and Veterans Af-23 fairs, and Full-Year Continuing Appropriations Act, 24 2013 (H.R. 933, as passed by the House of Rep $\overline{7}$

- resentatives on March 6, 2013), as reduced pursuant
 to the provisions of division D of such Act.
- 3 (2) The amount by which the amount made
 4 available for "House of Representatives—Committee
 5 Employees, Standing Committees, Special and Se6 lect" for fiscal year 2014 exceeds the amount made
 7 available for "House of Representatives—Committee
 8 Employees, Standing Committees, Special and Se9 lect" for fiscal year 2013.

(c) ALLOCATION TO COMMITTEES.—Amounts in the
reserve fund under this section shall be paid to a committee pursuant to an allocation approved by the Committee on House Administration.

14 SEC. 7. ADJUSTMENT AUTHORITY.

15 The Committee on House Administration shall have 16 authority to make adjustments in amounts under section 17 1, if necessary to comply with an order of the President 18 issued under section 251A or 254 of the Balanced Budget 19 and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 or to conform 20 to any change in appropriations for the purposes of such 21 section 1.
