JOINT RESOLUTION

Making continuing appropriations for the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the Bureau of Indian Education, and the Indian Health Service for fiscal year 2014, and for other purposes.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
 of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 That the following sums are hereby appropriated, out of
 any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,
 and out of applicable corporate or other revenues, receipts,
 and funds, for the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the Bureau

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of Indian Education, and the Indian Health Service, and
 for other purposes, namely:

3 SEC. 101. (a) Such amounts as may be necessary, 4 at a rate for operations as provided in the Full-Year Continuing Appropriations Act, 2013 (division F of Public 5 Law 113–6) and under the authority and conditions pro-6 7 vided in such Act, for continuing projects or activities (in-8 cluding the costs of direct loans and loan guarantees) that 9 are not otherwise specifically provided for in this joint res-10 olution, that were conducted in fiscal year 2013, and for 11 which appropriations, funds, or other authority were made 12 available by such Act under the following headings:

13 (1) "Department of the Interior—Bureau of In14 dian Affairs and Bureau of Indian Education".

15 (2) "Department of Health and Human Serv-16 ices—Indian Health Service".

(b) The rate for operations provided by subsection (a)
for each account shall be calculated to reflect the full
amount of any reduction required in fiscal year 2013 pursuant to—

(1) any provision of division G of the Consolidated and Further Continuing Appropriations Act,
2013 (Public Law 113-6), including section 3004;
and

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(2) the Presidential sequestration order dated
 March 1, 2013, except as attributable to budget au thority made available by the Disaster Relief Appro priations Act, 2013 (Public Law 113–2).

5 SEC. 102. Appropriations made by section 101 shall
6 be available to the extent and in the manner that would
7 be provided by the pertinent appropriations Act.

8 SEC. 103. Unless otherwise provided for in this joint 9 resolution or in the applicable appropriations Act for fiscal 10 year 2014, appropriations and funds made available and authority granted pursuant to this joint resolution shall 11 be available until whichever of the following first occurs: 12 13 (1) the enactment into law of an appropriation for any project or activity provided for in this joint resolution; (2) 14 15 the enactment into law of the applicable appropriations Act for fiscal year 2014 without any provision for such 16 project or activity; or (3) December 15, 2013. 17

18 SEC. 104. Expenditures made pursuant to this joint 19 resolution shall be charged to the applicable appropriation, 20 fund, or authorization whenever a bill in which such appli-21 cable appropriation, fund, or authorization is contained is 22 enacted into law.

SEC. 105. This joint resolution shall be implementedso that only the most limited funding action of that per-

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mitted in the joint resolution shall be taken in order to
 provide for continuation of projects and activities.

3 SEC. 106. Amounts made available under section 101 4 for civilian personnel compensation and benefits in each 5 department and agency may be apportioned up to the rate 6 for operations necessary to avoid furloughs within such de-7 partment or agency, consistent with the applicable appro-8 priations Act for fiscal year 2013, except that such author-9 ity provided under this section shall not be used until after 10 the department or agency has taken all necessary actions to reduce or defer non-personnel-related administrative ex-11 12 penses.

SEC. 107. It is the sense of Congress that this joint
resolution may also be referred to as the "American Indian and Alaska Native, Health, Education, and Safety
Act".

This joint resolution may be cited as the "Bureau of
Indian Affairs, Bureau of Indian Education, and Indian
Health Service Continuing Appropriations Resolution,
2014".
