A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a special resource study of the West Hunter Street Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia, and for other purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "West Hunter Street Bap-
5	tist Church Study Act".
6	SEC. 2. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.
7	(a) Study.—The Secretary of the Interior shall con-
8	duct a special resource study of the historic West Hunter
9	Street Baptist Church, located at 775 Martin Luther King
10	Jr. Drive, SW., Atlanta, Georgia and the block on which
11	the church is located.
12	(b) Contents.—In conducting the study under sub-
13	section (a), the Secretary shall—
14	(1) evaluate the national significance of the site;
15	(2) determine the suitability and feasibility of
16	designating the area as a unit of the National Park
17	System;
18	(3) consider other alternatives for preservation,
19	protection, and interpretation of the site by Federal,
20	State, or local governmental entities, or private and
21	$non profit\ organizations;$
22	(4) consult with interested Federal, State, or
23	local governmental entities, private and nonprofit or-
24	ganizations or any other interested individuals;

1	(5) identify cost estimates for any Federal acqui-
2	sition, development, interpretation, operation, and
3	maintenance associated with the alternatives;
4	(6) consider the effect of the designation of the
5	study area as a unit of the National Park System
6	on—
7	(A) existing commercial and recreational
8	activities, including but not limited to hunting,
9	fishing, and recreational shooting, and on the
10	authorization, construction, operation, mainte-
11	nance, or improvement of energy production and
12	transmission infrastructure; and
13	(B) the authority of State and local govern-
14	ments to manage those activities.
15	(7) identify any authorities, including con-
16	demnation, that will compel or permit the Secretary
17	to influence or participate in local land use decisions
18	(such as zoning) or place restrictions on non-Federal
19	lands if the study area is designated a unit of the Na-
20	tional Park System.
21	(c) Notification of Private Property Owners.—
22	Upon commencement of the study, owners of private prop-
23	erty adjacent to the area will be notified of the study's com-
24	mencement and scope.

- 1 (d) APPLICABLE LAW.—The study required under sub-
- 2 section (a) shall be conducted in accordance with the Na-
- 3 tional Park System General Authorities Act (16 U.S.C. 1a-
- 4 5(c)).
- 5 (e) Report.—Not later than 3 years after the date on
- 6 which funds are first made available for the study under
- 7 subsection (a), the Secretary shall submit to the Committee
- 8 on Natural Resources of the House of Representatives and
- 9 the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Sen-
- 10 ate a report containing the results of the study and any
- 11 conclusions and recommendations of the Secretary.
