Suspend the Rules and Pass the Bill, H.R. 3033, with an Amendment

(The amendment strikes all after the enacting clause and inserts a new text)

A BILL

 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

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1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Research Excellence
3 and Advancements for Dyslexia Act" or the "READ Act".
4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

5 The Congress finds the following:

6 (1) As many as one out of six, or 8,500,000,
7 American school children may have dyslexia.

8 (2) Since 1975, dyslexia has been included in 9 the list of qualifying learning disabilities under the 10 Education for All Handicapped Children Act of 11 1975 and the Individuals with Disabilities Education 12 Act.

13 SEC. 3. RESEARCH IN DISABILITIES EDUCATION.

14 (a) PROGRAM.—Nothing in this Act alters the National Science Foundation's Research in Disabilities Edu-15 16 cation program for fundamental and implementation research about learners (of all ages) with disabilities, includ-17 ing dyslexia, in science, technology, engineering, and 18 19 mathematics (STEM). The National Science Foundation 20shall continue to encourage efforts to understand and ad-21 dress disability-based differences in STEM education and 22 workforce participation, including differences for dyslexic 23 learners.

24 (b) LINE ITEM.—The Director of the National25 Science Foundation shall include the amount requested for

the Research in Disabilities Education program in the
 Foundation's annual congressional budget justification.

3 SEC. 4. DYSLEXIA.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The National Science Foundation 5 shall support multi-directorate, merit-reviewed, and competitively awarded research on the science of dyslexia, in-6 7 cluding research on the early identification of children and 8 students with dyslexia, professional development for teach-9 ers and administrators of students with dyslexia, curricula 10 and educational tools needed for children with dyslexia, and implementation and scaling of successful models of 11 12 dyslexia intervention. Research supported under this sub-13 section shall be conducted with the goal of practical application. 14

(b) FUNDING.—The National Science Foundation 15 shall devote at least \$5,000,000 annually to research de-16 scribed in subsection (a), subject to the availability of ap-17 propriations, to come from amounts made available for the 18 Research and Related Activities account or the Education 19 and Human Resources Directorate. No additional funds 20 21 are authorized to be appropriated under this section. This 22 Act shall be carried out using funds otherwise appro-23 priated by law after the date of enactment of this Act.
