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1SEC. 2. AVIATION SECURITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE CON-2SULTATION.

3 The Administrator of the Transportation Security 4 Administration shall consult, to the extent practicable, 5 with the Aviation Security Advisory Committee (estab-6 lished pursuant to section 44946 of title 49 of the United 7 States Code) regarding any modification to the prohibited 8 item list prior to issuing a determination about any such 9 modification.

10 sec. 3. Report on the transportation security11Oversight board.

12 Not later than 120 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Homeland Security shall 13 14 submit to the Transportation Security Oversight Board (established pursuant to section 115 of title 49, United 15 States Code), the Committee on Homeland Security of the 16 House of Representatives, and the Committee on Home-17 land Security and Governmental Affairs and the Com-18 19 mittee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the 20Senate a report that includes general information on how 21 often the Board has met, the current composition of the 22 Board, and what activities the Board has undertaken, con-23 sistent with the duties specified in subsection (c) of such 24 section. The Administrator may include in such report recommendations for changes to such section in consideration 25

of the provisions of section 44946 of title 49, United
 States Code.

3 SEC. 4. TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS.

4 (a) TERMS.—Subparagraph (A) of section
5 44946(c)(2) of title 49, United States Code, is amended
6 to read as follows:

7 "(A) TERMS.—The term of each member
8 of the Advisory Committee shall be two years
9 but may continue until such time as a successor
10 member begins serving on the Advisory Com11 mittee. A member of the Advisory Committee
12 may be reappointed.".

(b) CLARIFICATION.—Paragraph (5) of section
44946(b) of title 49, United States Code, is amended by
striking "under paragraph (4)" and inserting "under this
subsection".

17 SEC. 5. DEFINITION.

In this Act, the term "prohibited item list" means the list of items passengers are prohibited from carrying as accessible property or on their persons through passenger screening checkpoints at airports, into sterile areas at airports, and on board passenger aircraft, pursuant to section 1540.111 of title 49, Code of Federal Regulations (as in effect on January 1, 2015).
