A BILL

To exempt importation and exportation of sea urchins and sea cucumbers from licensing requirements under the Endangered Species Act of 1973.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. EXEMPTION OF EXPORTATION OF CERTAIN
4	ECHINODERMS AND MOLLUSKS FROM PER-
5	MISSION AND LICENSING REQUIREMENTS.
6	(a) Exemption.—Not later than 30 days after the date
7	of the enactment of this Act, the Director of the United
8	States Fish and Wildlife Service shall amend section 14.92
9	of title 50, Code of Federal Regulations, to clarify that—
10	(1) fish or wildlife described in subsection (b) are
11	fishery products exempt from the export permission
12	requirements of section $9(d)(1)$ of the Endangered
13	Species Act of 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1538(d)(1)); and
14	(2) any person may engage in business as an ex-
15	porter of such fish or wildlife without procuring per-
16	mission under such section of that Act or an export
17	license under subpart I of part 14 of such title.
18	(b) Covered Fish or Wildlife.—The fish or wild-
19	life referred to in subsection (a) are members of the phylum
20	Echinodermata that are commonly known as sea urchins
21	and sea cucumbers, and members of the phylum Mollusca
22	that are commonly known as squid, octopus, and cuttlefish,
23	including products thereof, that—
24	(1) do not require a permit under part 16, 17,
25	or 23 of title 50, Code of Federal Regulations;

1	(2) are harvested in waters under the jurisdic-
2	tion of the United States or are processed in the
3	United States; and
4	(3) are—
5	(A) exported for purposes of human or ani-
6	mal consumption; or
7	(B) taken in waters under the jurisdiction
8	of the United States or on the high seas for rec-
9	reational purposes.

Amend the title so as to read: "A bill to exempt exportation of certain echinoderms and mollusks from licensing requirements under the Endangered Species Act of 1973.".
