## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Strengthening the De-5 partment of Homeland Security Secure Mail Initiative6 Act".

# 7 SEC. 2. OPTION FOR SIGNATURE REQUIREMENT UNDER 8 THE SECURE MAIL INITIATIVE.

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—Beginning not later than one year 10 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Homeland Security shall provide for an option under 11 12 the Secure Mail Initiative (or any successor program) 13 under which a person to whom a document is sent under that initiative may require that the United States Postal 14 15 Service obtain a signature from that person in order to 16 deliver the document.

(b) FEE.—The Secretary shall require the payment
of a fee from a person requiring a signature under subsection (a). Such fee may be set at a level that will ensure
recovery of the full costs of providing all such services.
Such fee may also be set at a level that will recover any
additional costs associated with the administration of the
fees collected.

9 year that a person required a signature under section 2(a).
