1 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

2 Congress finds the following:

3 (1) Magnetic EEG/EKG-guided resonance ther4 apy has successfully treated more than 400 veterans
5 with post-traumatic stress disorder, traumatic brain
6 injury, military sexual trauma, chronic pain, and
7 opiate addiction.

8 (2) Recent clinical trials and randomized, pla9 cebo-controlled, double-blind studies have produced
10 promising measurable outcomes in the evolution of
11 magnetic EEG/EKG-guided resonance therapy.

(3) These outcomes have resulted in escalating
demand from returning warriors and veterans who
are seeking access to this treatment.

(4) Congress recognizes the importance of initiating innovative pilot programs that demonstrate the
use and effectiveness of new treatment options for
post-traumatic stress disorder, traumatic brain injury, military sexual trauma, chronic pain, and opiate addiction.

21 SEC. 3. MAGNETIC EEG/EKG-GUIDED RESONANCE THERAPY 22 PILOT PROGRAM.

(a) PILOT PROGRAM.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall carry out a pilot program to provide access to
magnetic EEG/EKG-guided resonance therapy to treat
larger populations of veterans suffering from post-trau-

matic stress disorder, traumatic brain injury, military sex ual trauma, chronic pain, or opiate addiction.

3 (b) LOCATIONS.—The Secretary shall carry out the
4 pilot program under subsection (a) at not more than two
5 facilities of the Department of Veteran Affairs.

6 (c) PARTICIPANTS.—In carrying out the pilot pro7 gram under subsection (a), the Secretary may not provide
8 access to magnetic EEG/EKG-guided resonance therapy
9 to more than 50 veterans.

10 (d) DURATION.—The Secretary shall carry out the11 pilot program under subsection (a) for a one-year period.

(e) REPORT.—Not later than 90 days after the date
of the termination of the pilot program under subsection
(a), the Secretary shall submit to the Committees on Veterans' Affairs of the House of Representatives and the
Senate a report on the pilot program.

(f) NO AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—No
additional funds are authorized to be appropriated to
carry out the requirements of this section. Such requirements shall be carried out using amounts otherwise authorized.
