Mr. PORTMAN (for himself, Mr. JOHNSON, and Mr. CARPER) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs

A BILL

To authorize the National Urban Search and Rescue Response System.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Urban Search
- 5 and Rescue Response System Act of 2016".

6 SEC. 2. NATIONAL URBAN SEARCH AND RESCUE RESPONSE
7 SYSTEM.

- 8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Title III of the Robert T. Stafford
- 9 Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C.

5141 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end the fol lowing:

3 "SEC. 327. NATIONAL URBAN SEARCH AND RESCUE RE4 SPONSE SYSTEM.

5 "(a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section, the following6 definitions shall apply:

7 "(1) ADMINISTRATOR.—The term 'Adminis8 trator' means the Administrator of the Federal
9 Emergency Management Agency.

10 "(2) AGENCY.—The term 'Agency' means the
11 Federal Emergency Management Agency.

12 "(3) HAZARD.—The term 'hazard' has the13 meaning given the term in section 602.

14 "(4) NONEMPLOYEE SYSTEM MEMBER.—The
15 term 'nonemployee System member' means a System
16 member not employed by a sponsoring agency or
17 participating agency.

"(5) PARTICIPATING AGENCY.—The term 'participating agency' means a State or local government, nonprofit organization, or private organization
that has executed an agreement with a sponsoring
agency to participate in the System.

23 "(6) SPONSORING AGENCY.—The term 'spon24 soring agency' means a State or local government

1	that is the sponsor of a task force designated by the
2	Administrator to participate in the System.

3 "(7) SYSTEM.—The term 'System' means the
4 National Urban Search and Rescue Response System to be administered under this section.

6 "(8) SYSTEM MEMBER.—The term 'System
7 member' means an individual who is not a full-time
8 employee of the Federal Government and who serves
9 on a task force or on a System management or other
10 technical team.

11 "(9) TASK FORCE.—The term 'task force'
12 means an urban search and rescue team designated
13 by the Administrator to participate in the System.

14 "(b) GENERAL AUTHORITY.—Subject to the require15 ments of this section, the Administrator shall continue to
16 administer the emergency response system known as the
17 National Urban Search and Rescue Response System.

"(c) FUNCTIONS.—In administering the System, the
Administrator shall provide for a national network of
standardized search and rescue resources to assist States
and local governments in responding to hazards.

22 "(d) TASK FORCES.—

23 "(1) DESIGNATION.—The Administrator shall
24 designate task forces to participate in the System.

The Administration shall determine the criteria for
 such participation.

3 "(2) SPONSORING AGENCIES.—Each task force
4 shall have a sponsoring agency. The Administrator
5 shall enter into an agreement with the sponsoring
6 agency with respect to the participation of each task
7 force in the System.

8 "(3) Composition.—

9 "(A) PARTICIPATING AGENCIES.—A task 10 force may include, at the discretion of the spon-11 soring agency, 1 or more participating agencies. 12 The sponsoring agency shall enter into an 13 agreement with each participating agency with 14 respect to the participation of the participating 15 agency on the task force.

"(B) OTHER INDIVIDUALS.—A task force 16 17 may also include, at the discretion of the spon-18 soring agency, other individuals not otherwise 19 associated with the sponsoring agency or a par-20 ticipating agency. The sponsoring agency of a 21 task force may enter into a separate agreement 22 with each such individual with respect to the 23 participation of the individual on the task force. "(e) MANAGEMENT AND TECHNICAL TEAMS.—The 24 Administrator shall maintain such management teams and 25

other technical teams as the Administrator determines are
 necessary to administer the System.

- 3 "(f) Appointment of System Members Into4 Federal Service.—
- 5 "(1) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator may ap-6 point a System member into Federal service for a 7 period of service to provide for the participation of 8 the System member in exercises, preincident staging, 9 major disaster and emergency response activities, 10 and training events sponsored or sanctioned by the 11 Administrator.
- "(2) NONAPPLICABILITY OF CERTAIN CIVIL
 SERVICE LAWS.—The Administrator may make appointments under paragraph (1) without regard to
 the provisions of title 5, United States Code, governing appointments in the competitive service.
- 17 "(3) RELATIONSHIP TO OTHER AUTHORI18 TIES.—The authority of the Administrator to make
 19 appointments under this subsection shall not affect
 20 any other authority of the Administrator under this
 21 Act.

"(4) LIMITATION.—A System member who is
appointed into Federal service under paragraph (1)
shall not be considered an employee of the United

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1	States for purposes other than those specifically set
2	forth in this section.
3	"(g) Compensation.—
4	"(1) PAY OF SYSTEM MEMBERS.—Subject to
5	such terms and conditions as the Administrator may
6	impose by regulation, the Administrator shall make
7	payments to the sponsoring agency of a task force—
8	"(A) to reimburse each employer of a Sys-
9	tem member on the task force for compensation
10	paid by the employer to the System member for
11	any period during which the System member is
12	appointed into Federal service under subsection
13	(f)(1); and
14	"(B) to make payments directly to a non-
15	employee System member on the task force for
16	any period during which the nonemployee Sys-
17	tem member is appointed into Federal service
18	under subsection $(f)(1)$.
19	"(2) Reimbursement for employees fill-
20	ING POSITIONS OF SYSTEM MEMBERS.—

21 "(A) IN GENERAL.—Subject to such terms and conditions as the Administrator may im-22 pose by regulation, the Administrator shall 23 make payments to the sponsoring agency of a 24 25 task force to be used to reimburse each em-

ployer of a System member on the task force
for compensation paid by the employer to an
employee filling a position normally filled by the
System member for any period during which
the System member is appointed into Federal
service under subsection (f)(1).

"(B) LIMITATION.—Costs incurred by an
employer shall be eligible for reimbursement
under subparagraph (A) only to the extent that
the costs are in excess of the costs that would
have been incurred by the employer had the
System member not been appointed into Federal service under subsection (f)(1).

14 "(3) METHOD OF PAYMENT.—A System mem15 ber shall not be entitled to pay directly from the
16 Agency for a period during which the System mem17 ber is appointed into Federal Service under sub18 section (f)(1).

19 "(h) PERSONAL INJURY, ILLNESS, DISABILITY, OR20 DEATH.—

"(1) IN GENERAL.—A System member who is
appointed into Federal service under subsection
(f)(1) and who suffers personal injury, illness, disability, or death as a result of a personal injury sustained while acting in the scope of such appoint-

ment, shall, for the purposes of subchapter I of
chapter 81 of title 5, United States Code, be treated
as though the member were an employee (as defined
by section 8101 of that title) who had sustained the
injury in the performance of duty.

6 "(2) ELECTION OF BENEFITS.—

7 "(A) IN GENERAL.—A System member 8 (or, in the case of the death of the System 9 member, the System member's dependent) who is entitled under paragraph (1) to receive bene-10 11 fits under subchapter I of chapter 81 of title 5, 12 United States Code, by reason of personal in-13 jury, illness, disability, or death, and to receive 14 benefits from a State or local government by 15 reason of the same personal injury, illness, dis-16 ability or death shall elect to—

17 "(i) receive benefits under such sub-18 chapter; or

19 "(ii) receive benefits from the State or20 local government.

21 "(B) DEADLINE.—A System member or
22 dependent shall make an election of benefits
23 under subparagraph (A) not later than 1 year
24 after the date of the personal injury, illness,
25 disability, or death that is the reason for the

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benefits, or until such later date as the Secretary of Labor may allow for reasonable cause shown.

4 "(C) EFFECT OF ELECTION.—An election
5 of benefits made under this paragraph is irrev6 ocable unless otherwise provided by law.

7 "(3) Reimbursement for state or local 8 BENEFITS.—Subject to such terms and conditions as 9 the Administrator may impose by regulation, if a 10 System member or dependent elects to receive bene-11 fits from a State or local government under para-12 graph (2)(A), the Administrator shall reimburse the 13 State or local government for the value of the bene-14 fits.

15 "(4) PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICER CLAIMS.—Noth-16 ing in this subsection shall be construed to bar any 17 claim by, or with respect to, any System member 18 who is a public safety officer, as defined in section 19 1204 of title I of the Omnibus Crime Control and 20 Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3796b), for any 21 benefits authorized under part L of title I of that 22 Act (42 U.S.C. 3796 et seq.).

23 "(i) LIABILITY.—A System member appointed into
24 Federal service under subsection (f)(1), while acting with25 in the scope of the appointment, shall be considered to

be an employee of the Federal Government under section
 1346(b) of title 28, United States Code, and chapter 171
 of that title, relating to tort claims procedure.

4 "(j) EMPLOYMENT AND REEMPLOYMENT RIGHTS.—
5 With respect to a System member who is not a regular
6 full-time employee of a sponsoring agency or participating
7 agency, the following terms and conditions apply:

8 "(1) SERVICE.—Service as a System member 9 shall be considered to be 'service in the uniformed 10 services' for purposes of chapter 43 of title 38, 11 United States Code, relating to employment and re-12 employment rights of individuals who have per-13 formed service in the uniformed services (regardless 14 of whether the individual receives compensation for 15 such participation). All rights and obligations of 16 such persons and procedures for assistance, enforce-17 ment, and investigation shall be as provided for in 18 such chapter.

19 "(2) PRECLUSION.—Preclusion of giving notice 20 of service by necessity of appointment under this 21 section shall be considered to be preclusion by 'mili-22 tary necessity' for purposes of section 4312(b) of 23 title 38, United States Code, pertaining to giving no-24 tice of absence from a position of employment. A de-25 termination of such necessity shall be made by the

Administrator and shall not be subject to judicial re view.

3 "(k) LICENSES AND PERMITS.—If a System member 4 holds a valid license, certificate, or other permit issued by 5 any State or other governmental jurisdiction evidencing 6 the member's qualifications in any professional, mechan-7 ical, or other skill or type of assistance required by the 8 System, the System member is deemed to be performing 9 a Federal activity when rendering aid involving such skill or assistance during a period of appointment into Federal 10 11 service under subsection (f)(1).

12 "(1) PREPAREDNESS COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.—
13 Subject to the availability of appropriations for such pur14 pose, the Administrator shall enter into an annual pre15 paredness cooperative agreement with each sponsoring
16 agency. Amounts made available to a sponsoring agency
17 under such a preparedness cooperative agreement shall be
18 for the following purposes:

19 "(1) Training and exercises, including training
20 and exercises with other Federal, State, and local
21 government response entities.

"(2) Acquisition and maintenance of equipment,
including interoperable communications and personal
protective equipment.

"(3) Medical monitoring required for responder
 safety and health in anticipation of and following a
 major disaster, emergency, or other hazard, as de termined by the Administrator.

5 "(m) RESPONSE COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.—The 6 Administrator shall enter into a response cooperative 7 agreement with each sponsoring agency, as appropriate, 8 under which the Administrator agrees to reimburse the 9 sponsoring agency for costs incurred by the sponsoring 10 agency in responding to a major disaster or emergency.

11 "(n) OBLIGATIONS.—The Administrator may incur
12 all necessary obligations consistent with this section in
13 order to ensure the effectiveness of the System.

14 "(0) Equipment Maintenance and Replace-15 MENT.—Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment of this section, the Administrator shall submit to the 16 17 appropriate congressional committees (as defined in section 2 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 18 19 101)) a report on the development of a plan, including implementation steps and timeframes, to finance, main-20 21 tain, and replace System equipment.".

18	(2) Inclusion as part of uniformed serv-
19	ICES FOR PURPOSES OF USERRA.—Section 4303 of
20	title 38, United States Code, is amended—
21	(A) in paragraph (13), by inserting ", a
22	period for which a System member of the Na-
23	tional Urban Search and Rescue Response Sys-
24	tem is absent from a position of employment
25	due to an appointment into Federal service

1	under section 327 of the Robert T. Stafford
2	Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act"
3	before ", and a period"; and
4	(B) in paragraph (16), by inserting "Sys-
5	tem members of the National Urban Search
6	and Rescue Response System during a period of
7	appointment into Federal service under section
8	327 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief
9	and Emergency Assistance Act," after "Public
10	Health Service,".
11	(c) Technical Amendment.—Section 1086(d) of
12	the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year
13	2013 is amended as follows (which amendments shall take
14	effect as if enacted on January 2, 2013)—
15	(1) in paragraph (1) —
16	(A) by striking "paragraph (1)" and in-
17	serting "paragraph (2)"; and
18	(B) in subparagraph (B) by striking "filed
19	or" and inserting "filed (consistent with pre-ex-
20	isting effective dates) or'; and
21	(2) in paragraph $(2)(A)$, by striking "amend-
22	ments made by this Act" and inserting "amend-
23	ments made to section 1204 of the Omnibus Crime
