A BILL

To require the Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency to submit a report regarding certain plans regarding assistance to applicants and grantees during the response to an emergency or disaster. 3

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. ACTION PLAN TO IMPROVE FIELD TRANSITION. 4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the 5 date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) shall report 6 7 to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure of 8 the House of Representatives and the Committee on Home-9 land Security and Governmental Affairs of the Senate re-10 garding the plans the agency will undertake to provide the 11 following: 12 (1) Consistent guidance to applicants on FEMA 13 disaster funding procedures during the response to an 14 emergency or disaster. 15 (2) Appropriate record maintenance and trans-16 fer of documents to new teams during staff transi-17 tions. 18 (3) Accurate assistance to applicants and grant-19 ees to ease the administrative burden throughout the 20 process of obtaining and monitoring assistance. 21 (b) MAINTAINING RECORDS.—The report shall also in-22 clude a plan for implementing operating procedures and 23 document retention requirements to ensure the maintenance 24 of appropriate records throughout the lifecycle of the emergency or disaster. 25

(c) NEW TECHNOLOGIES.—Finally, the report shall
identify new technologies that further aid the disaster work force in partnering with State, local, and tribal govern ments and private nonprofits in the wake of a disaster or
emergency to educate, assist, and inform applicants on the
status of their emergency or disaster assistance applications
and projects.
