A BILL

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to reauthorize the Border Enforcement Security Task Force program within the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Border Enforcement

1 SEC. 2. MODIFIED INSTRUCTIONS.

2	(a) Updated Considerations for the Estab-
3	LISHMENT OF UNITS.—Paragraph (2) of section 432(c)
4	of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 240(c))
5	is amended—
6	(1) in the matter preceding subparagraph (A),
7	by striking "the Secretary shall consider" and in-
8	serting "the Secretary shall apply risk-based criteria
9	that takes into consideration"; and
10	(2) in subparagraph (A), by inserting before the
11	semicolon the following: ", including threats posed
12	by transnational criminal organizations";
13	(3) in subparagraph (C), by striking "and"
14	after the semicolon;
15	(4) in subparagraph (D), by striking the period
16	at the end and inserting "; and; and
17	(5) by adding at the end the following new sub-
18	paragraphs:
19	"(E) the extent to which the BEST unit
20	would advance the Department's homeland and
21	border security strategic priorities and related

23	"(F) whether departmental Joint Task

3	(b) Port Security.—Subsection (c) of section 432

8	unit established pursuant to paragraph (2) with a
9	port security nexus shall be composed of at least one
10	member of each of the following:
11	"(A) The Coast Guard Investigative Serv-

14	Guard Sector Intelligence Office.".
15	(c) Updated Report Elements.—Subsection (e)
16	of section 432 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6
17	U.S.C. 240) is amended to read as follows:
18	"(e) Report.—Not later than 180 days after the
19	date of the enactment of this section and annually there-
20	after for the following five years, the Secretary shall sub-
21	mit to Congress a report that includes the following:
22	"(1) A description of the effectiveness of BEST

25	reducing drug trafficking, arms smuggling, illegal

3	of the United States, as measured by crime statis-
4	tics, including violent deaths, incidents of violence,
5	and drug-related arrests.
6	"(2) An assessment of how BEST enhances in-
7	formation-sharing, including the dissemination of
8	homeland security information, among Federal,
9	State, local, tribal, and foreign law enforcement
10	agencies.
11	"(3) A description of how BEST advances the
12	Department's homeland and border security stra-
13	tegic priorities and effectiveness of BEST in achiev-
14	ing related objectives.
15	"(4) An assessment of BEST's joint operational
16	efforts with departmental Joint Task Force oper-
17	ations established pursuant to section 708 and other
18	joint cross-border initiatives.".
