## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Reporting Efficiently
- 5 to Proper Officials in Response to Terrorism Act of 2017"
- 6 or the "REPORT Act".

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## 1 SEC. 2. DUTY TO REPORT.

2 (a) DUTY IMPOSED.—Whenever an act of terrorism 3 occurs in the United States, it shall be the duty of the Secretary of Homeland Security, the Attorney General, 4 5 the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and, as appropriate, the head of the National Counterterrorism 6 7 Center, to submit, within one year of the completion of 8 the investigation concerning such act by the primary Gov-9 ernment agency conducting such investigation, an unclassified report (which may be accompanied by a classified 10 11 annex) to Congress concerning such act.

12 (b) CONTENT OF REPORTS.—A report under this sec-13 tion shall—

14 (1) include a statement of the facts of the act
15 of terrorism referred to in subsection (a), as known
16 at the time of the report;

17 (2) identify any gaps in national security that
18 could be addressed to prevent future acts of ter19 rorism; and

20 (3) any recommendations for additional meas21 ures that could be taken to improve homeland secu22 rity, including potential changes in law enforcement
23 practices or changes in law, with particular attention
24 to changes that could help prevent future acts of ter25 rorism.

(c) EXCEPTION.—The duty established under sub-1 2 section (a) shall not apply in instances in which the Secretary of Homeland Security, the Attorney General, the 3 Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, or the 4 5 head of the National Counterterrorism Center determines that the information required to be reported could jeop-6 7 ardize an ongoing investigation or prosecution. In such instances, the Secretary shall notify Congress of such prior 8 to the first anniversary of the completion of the investiga-9 tion described in such subsection. 10

(d) DEFINITION.—In this section, the term "act of
terrorism" has the meaning given such term in section
3077 of title 18, United States Code.
