1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Ensuring Veteran En-

5	CATION OF SUFFICIENT PARTICIPATION OF

12	(a) Certification Required.—Not later than 180
13	days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-

17	each contract (except for domestic delivery services)

21	(2) The term "category" means—
22	(A) a type of supply or service for which
23	a suite of contracts has been established under
24	the Federal Strategic Sourcing Initiative; or

1	(B) any further subdivision or grouping
2	within such a suite of contracts.
3	(3) The term "sufficient number", with respect
4	to a type of business concern, means not fewer than
5	two and enough to maximize the percentage of or-
6	ders entered into by the Secretary with such busi-
7	ness concerns, as determined by the Secretary.
