6	SEC. 2. PAYMENTS FROM UNITED STATES CAPITOL POLICE
7	MEMORIAL FUND TO EMPLOYEES SUS-
8	TAINING SERIOUS LINE-OF-DUTY INJURIES.
9	(a) Authorizing Payments From Fund.—Section
10	2 of Public Law 105–223 (2 U.S.C. 1952) is amended—
