## **RESOLUTION**

Requiring each Member, officer, and employee of the House of Representatives to complete a program of training in workplace rights and responsibilities each session of each Congress, and for other purposes.

1 Resolved,

2 SECTION 1. MANDATORY COMPLETION OF PROGRAM OF
3 TRAINING IN WORKPLACE RIGHTS AND RE4 SPONSIBILITIES.

5 (a) Requiring Training for All Members, Offi-

6 CERS, AND EMPLOYEES.—

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1 (1) REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 30 days 2 after the date of the enactment of this resolution, 3 the Committee on House Administration shall issue 4 regulations to provide that, during each session of 5 each Congress, each Member (including each Dele-6 gate or Resident Commissioner to the Congress), of-7 ficer, and employee of the House of Representatives 8 shall complete a program of training in the work-9 place rights and responsibilities applicable to offices 10 and employees of the House under part A of title II 11 of the Congressional Accountability Act of 1995 (2) 12 U.S.C. 1301 et seq.), including anti-discrimination 13 and anti-harassment training.

14 (2) INCLUSION OF INTERNS, FELLOWS, AND 15 DETAILEES.—For purposes of this resolution, an in-16 dividual serving in an office of the House of Rep-17 resentatives as an intern (including an unpaid in-18 tern), a participant in a fellowship program, or a 19 detailee from another office of the Federal govern-20 ment shall be considered an employee of the House. 21 (b) DEADLINE.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Under the regulations issued
by the Committee on House Administration under
subsection (a), an individual shall complete the program of training required under subsection (a) and

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file a certificate of completion of such training not
 later than—

3 (A) in the case of an individual who is
4 serving as a Member, officer, or employee of the
5 House as of the first day of a session of Con6 gress, not later than 90 days after the session
7 begins; or

8 (B) in the case of any other individual, not 9 later than 90 days after the individual first be-10 comes a Member, officer, or employee of the 11 House during the session.

(2) SPECIAL RULE FOR ONE HUNDRED FIFTEENTH CONGRESS.—In the case of the One Hundred Fifteenth Congress, an individual shall complete the program required under subsection (a) not
later than 180 days after the second session of the
Congress begins.

(c) ADDITIONAL MECHANISMS.—The Committee on
House Administration shall consider additional mechanisms to ensure compliance with the training requirement
under subsection (a).

4 The Committee on House Administration shall issue 5 regulations to provide that each employing office of the House of Representatives shall post in a prominent loca-6 tion in the office (including, in the case of the office of 7 8 a Member of the House or a Delegate or Resident Commissioner to the Congress, a prominent location in each 9 10 office in the Member's congressional district) a statement of the rights and protections provided to employees of the 11 12 House of Representatives under the Congressional Accountability Act of 1995, including the procedures avail-13 able to employees of the House under such Act for re-14 sponding to and adjudicating allegations of violations of 15 such rights and protections. 16
