A BILL

To establish a working group to determine ways to develop a domestic canine breeding network to produce high quality explosives detection canines, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 This Act may be cited as the "Domestic Explosives De-

5 tection Canine Capacity Building Act of 2017".

6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

7 In this Act:

8 (1) BEHAVIORAL STANDARDS.—The term "behav-9 ioral standards" means standards for the evaluation 10 of explosives detection working canines for certain 11 factors, including canine temperament, work drive, 12 suitability for training, environmental factors used in evaluations, and canine familiarity with natural or 13 14 man-made surfaces or working conditions relevant to 15 the canine's expected work area.

16 (2) MEDICAL STANDARDS.—The term "medical
17 standards" means standards for the evaluation of ex18 plosives detection working canines for certain factors,
19 including canine health, management of heredity
20 health conditions, breeding practices, genetics, pedi21 gree, and long-term health tracking.

(3) TECHNICAL STANDARDS.—The term "technical standards" means standards for the evaluation
of explosives detection working canines for certain
factors, including canine search techniques, handler-

1	canine communication, detection testing conditions
2	and logistics, and learned explosive odor libraries.
3	SEC. 3. DOMESTIC CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT.
4	(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the
5	date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Homeland
6	Security, acting through the Administrator of the Transpor-
7	tation Security Administration, shall establish a working
8	group to determine ways to develop a decentralized domestic
9	canine breeding network to produce high quality explosives
10	detection canines and modernize canine training standards.
11	(b) Working Group Composition.—The working
12	group established under subsection (a) shall be comprised
13	of representatives from the following:
14	(1) The Transportation Security Administra-
15	tion.
16	(2) The Science and Technology Directorate of
17	the Department of Homeland Security.
18	(3) National domestic canine associations with
19	expertise in breeding and pedigree.
20	(4) Universities with expertise related to explo-
21	sives detection canines and canine breeding.
22	(5) Domestic canine breeders and vendors.
23	(c) CHAIRPERSONS.—The Administrator for the

24 Transportation Security Administration shall approve of

25 two individuals from among the representatives of the work-

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ing group specified in subsection (b) to serve as the Chair persons of the working group. One such Chairperson shall
 be from the entities specified in paragraphs (1) and (2) of
 such subsection, and the other such Chairperson shall be
 from the entities specified in paragraphs (3), (4), and (5)
 of such subsection.

7 (d) Preliminary Standards and Recommenda-8 TIONS.—Not later than 180 days after the establishment of 9 the working group under subsection (a), such working group 10 shall submit to the Administrator of the Transportation Security Administration preliminary behavioral standards, 11 12 medical standards, and technical standards for the domestic canine breeding network and canine training described in 13 such subsection, including recommendations on how the 14 15 Transportation Security Administration can engage stakeholders to further the development of such network and 16 training. 17

(e) STRATEGY.—Not later than 180 days after submission of recommendations to the Administrator of the Transportation Security Administration under subsection (c), the
Administrator shall submit to the Committee on Homeland
Security of the House of Representatives and the Committee
on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate
a strategy for expanding the domestic canine breeding net-

work described in subsection (a), based on such rec ommendations.

3 (f) CONSULTATION.—In developing the strategy re-4 quired under subsection (e), the Administrator of the Trans-5 portation Security Administration shall consult with the Under Secretary for Science and Technology of the Depart-6 7 ment of Homeland Security, the Commissioner for U.S. 8 Customs and Border Protection, the Director of the United 9 States Secret Service, and the heads of other Department 10 of Homeland Security components determined appropriate by the Administrator to incorporate, to the extent prac-11 ticable, mission needs across the Department for an ex-12 13 panded domestic explosives detection canine breeding network that can be leveraged to help meet the Department's 14 15 operational needs.

16 (g) SUNSET.—The working group established under 17 subsection (a) shall terminate on the date that is two years 18 after the submission of the strategy required under sub-19 section (e).

20 SEC. 4. ACQUIRING BASELINE CAPACITY.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 270 days after the
submission of recommendations to the Administrator of the
Transportation Security Administration under section 3,
the Administrator shall issue baseline behavioral standards,

medical standards, and technical standards for explosives
 detection canines.

3 (b) STANDARDS.—The baseline behavioral standards, 4 medical standards, and technical standards referred to in 5 subsection (a) shall be incorporated, as appropriate, into 6 all statements of work for the Transportation Security Ad-7 ministration explosives detection canine contracts and re-8 flect the detection capabilities required to effectively miti-9 gate terrorist threats. Such standards may be revised by 10 the Administrator of the Transportation Security Adminis-11 tration, as necessary.

12 SEC. 5. NONAPPLICABILITY OF FEDERAL ADVISORY COM-13 MITTEE ACT.

14 The Federal Advisory Committee Act (5 U.S.C. App.)
15 shall not apply to the working group established under this
16 Act.
