## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to increase the number of peer-to-peer counselors providing counseling for women veterans, and for other purposes. 3

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. PEER SUPPORT COUNSELING PROGRAM FOR
 WOMEN VETERANS.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1720F(j) of title 38, United
6 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the following
7 new paragraph:

8 "(4)(A) As part of the counseling program under this 9 subsection, the Secretary shall emphasize appointing peer 10 support counselors for women veterans. To the degree prac-11 ticable, the Secretary shall seek to recruit women peer sup-12 port counselors with expertise in—

13 *"(i) female gender-specific issues and services;* 

14 "(ii) the provision of information about services
15 and benefits provided under laws administered by the
16 Secretary; or

17 *"(iii) employment mentoring.* 

18 "(B) To the degree practicable, the Secretary shall em-19 phasize facilitating peer support counseling for women vet-20 erans who are eligible for counseling and services under sec-21 tion 1720D of this title, have post-traumatic stress disorder 22 or suffer from another mental health condition, are homeless 23 or at risk of becoming homeless, or are otherwise at in-24 creased risk of suicide, as determined by the Secretary. 4

"(C) The Secretary shall conduct outreach to inform
 women veterans about the program and the assistance
 available under this paragraph.

4 "(D) In carrying out this paragraph, the Secretary
5 shall coordinate with such community organizations, State
6 and local governments, institutions of higher education,
7 chambers of commerce, local business organizations, organi8 zations that provide legal assistance, and other organiza9 tions as the Secretary considers appropriate.

"(E) In carrying out this paragraph, the Secretary
shall provide adequate training for peer support counselors,
including training carried out under the national program
of training required by section 304(c) of the Caregivers and
Veterans Omnibus Health Services Act of 2010 (38 U.S.C.
1712A note).".

(b) FUNDING.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall
carry out paragraph (4) of section 1720F(j) of title 38,
United States Code, as added by subsection (a), using funds
otherwise made available to the Secretary. No additional
funds are authorized to be appropriated by reason of such
paragraph.

(c) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—Not later than two years
after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary
of Veterans Affairs shall submit to the Committees on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and House of Representatives

a report on the peer support counseling program under sec tion 1720F(j) of title 38, United States Code, as amended
 by this section. Such report shall include—
 (1) the number of peer support counselors in the
 program;
 (2) an assessment of the effectiveness of the pro gram; and
 (3) a description of the oversight of the program.
