5 (a) INITIAL NOTICE.—Not later than 10 business days after the Federal Railroad Administration initiates 6 7 a comprehensive safety assessment of an entity providing $\mathbf{2}$

regularly scheduled intercity or commuter rail passenger 1 transportation, the Federal Railroad Administration shall 2 notify in electronic format the Committee on Transpor-3 4 tation and Infrastructure of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transpor-5 tation of the Senate, and each member of Congress rep-6 7 resenting a State in which the service that is the subject 8 of the assessment being conducted is located, of the initi-9 ation of that assessment.

10 (b) FINDINGS.—Not later than 90 days after completion of a comprehensive safety assessment described in 11 12 subsection (a), the Federal Railroad Administration shall transmit in electronic format to the Committee on Trans-13 portation and Infrastructure of the House of Representa-14 15 tives and the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate, and to each member of Con-16 17 gress representing a State in which the service that is the 18 subject of the assessment being conducted is located, its 19 findings of that assessment, including identified defects 20and any recommendations.

(c) DEFINITION.—For purpose of this section, the
term "comprehensive safety assessment" means a focused
review of the safety-related processes and procedures,
compliance with safety regulations and requirements, and
overall safety culture of an entity providing regularly

- 1 scheduled intercity or commuter rail passenger transpor-
