### A BILL

To amend title 44, United States Code, to modernize the Federal Register, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Register Mod-
- 5 ernization Act".

1	SEC. 2. FEDERAL REGISTER MODERNIZATION.
2	(a) References to Printing.—Chapter 15 of title
3	44, United States Code, is amended—
4	(1) in section 1502—
5	(A) in the heading, by striking " <b>print-</b>
6	<b>ing</b> " and inserting " <b>publishing</b> "; and
7	(B) by striking "printing and distribution"
8	and inserting "publishing";
9	(2) in section 1507—
10	(A) by striking "the duplicate originals or
11	certified copies of the document have" and in-
12	serting "the document has"; and
13	(B) in paragraph (2), by striking "print-
14	ed" and inserting "published"; and
15	(3) in section 1509, in subsections (a) and (b),
16	by striking "printing, reprinting, wrapping, binding,
17	and distributing" and inserting "publishing", each
18	place it appears.
19	(b) Publish Defined.—Section 1501 of title 44,
20	United States Code, is amended—
21	(1) by striking "; and" at the end of the defini-
22	tion for "person" and inserting a semicolon; and
23	(2) by inserting after the definition for "per-
24	son" the following:
25	"'publish' means to circulate for sale or dis-
26	tribution to the public; and".

(c) FILING DOCUMENTS WITH OFFICE AMEND MENT.—Section 1503 of title 44, United States Code, is
 amended to read as follows:

# 4 "§1503. Filing documents with Office; notation of 5 time; public inspection; transmission for 6 publishing

"The original document required or authorized to be 7 8 published by section 1505 shall be filed with the Office 9 of the Federal Register for publication at times estab-10 lished by the Administrative Committee of the Federal Register by regulation. The Archivist of the United States 11 12 shall cause to be noted on the original of each document the day and hour of filing. Upon filing, the document shall 13 be immediately available for public inspection in the Of-14 15 fice. The original shall be retained by the National Ar-16 chives and Records Administration and shall be available for inspection under regulations prescribed by the Archi-17 18 vist, unless such original is disposed of in accordance with disposal schedules submitted by the Administrative Com-19 mittee and authorized by the Archivist pursuant to regula-2021 tions issued under chapter 33; however, originals of proc-22 lamations of the President and Executive orders shall be 23 permanently retained by the Administration as part of the 24 National Archives of the United States. The Office shall 25 transmit to the Government Publishing Office, as provided

by this chapter, each document required or authorized to
 be published by section 1505. Every Federal agency shall
 cause to be transmitted for filing the original of all such
 documents issued, prescribed, or promulgated by the agen cy.".

6 (d) FEDERAL REGISTER AMENDMENT.—Section

The Director of the Gov-14 15 ernment Publishing Office shall make available the facilities of the Government Publishing Office for the prompt 16 publication of the Federal Register in the manner and at 17 18 the times required by this chapter and the regulations pre-19 scribed under it. The contents of the daily issues shall be 20 indexed and constitute all documents, required or author-21 ized to be published, filed with the Office of the Federal 22 Register up to the time of the day immediately preceding 23 the day of publication fixed by regulations under this 24 chapter. There shall be published with each document a 25 copy of the notation, required to be made by section 1503,

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of the day and hour when, upon filing with the Office, 1 the document was made available for public inspection. 2 Distribution shall be made at a time in the morning of 3 4 the day of distribution fixed by regulations prescribed under this chapter. Office does not fulfill the publication requirements of this
 chapter, the Office of the Federal Register may establish
 a website to publish the Federal Register until such time
 that the Government Publishing Office resumes publica tion."; and

(f) ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE OF THE FEDERAL
REGISTER AMENDMENT.—Subsection (a) of section 1506
of title 44, United States Code, is amended to read as
follows:

17 "(a) COMPOSITION; DUTIES.—The Administrative Committee of the Federal Register shall consist of the Ar-18 19 chivist of the United States or Acting Archivist, who shall 20chair the committee, an officer of the Department of Jus-21 tice designated by the Attorney General, and the Director 22 of the Government Publishing Office or Acting Director 23 of the Government Publishing Office. The Director of the 24 Federal Register shall act as secretary of the committee. 25 The committee shall prescribe, with the approval of the

President, regulations for carrying out this chapter. The
 regulations shall provide for, among other things—

  19 and any reprints and bound volumes of it;
- 20 "(6) the manner and form by which the Federal
  21 Register may receive information and comments
  22 from the public, if practicable and efficient; and
  - "(7) special editions of the Federal Register.".

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(g) CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS AMEND MENT.—Section 1510 of title 44, United States Code, is
 amended to read as follows:

### 4 "§ 1510. Code of Federal Regulations

5 "(a) Special Edition for Codification of Agen-6 CY DOCUMENTS.—The Administrative Committee of the 7 Federal Register, with the approval of the President, may 8 require, from time to time as it considers necessary, the 9 preparation and publication in a special edition of the Federal Register a complete codification of the documents of 10 each agency of the Government having general applica-11 12 bility and legal effect, issued or promulgated by the agency by publication in the Federal Register or by filing with 13 the Administrative Committee, and which are relied upon 14 15 by the agency as authority for, or are invoked or used by it in the discharge of, its activities or functions, and are 16 in effect as to facts arising on or after dates specified by 17 the Administrative Committee. 18

"(b) CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS.—A codification prepared under subsection (a) of this section shall be
published and shall be designated as the 'Code of Federal
Regulations'. The Administrative Committee shall regulate the manner and forms of publishing this codification.
"(c) SUPPLEMENTATION, COLLATION, AND REPUBLICATION.—The Administrative Committee shall regulate

the supplementation and the collation and republication 1 2 of the codification with a view to keeping the Code of Fed-3 eral Regulations as current as practicable. Each unit of 4 codification shall be supplemented and republished at least 5 once each calendar year. The Office of the Federal Register may create updates of each unit of codification from 6 7 time to time and make the same available electronically 8 or may provide public access using an electronic edition 9 that allows a user to select a specific date and retrieve the version of the codification in effect as of that date. 10 11 "(d) PREPARATION AND PUBLICATION BY THE FED-ERAL REGISTER.—The Office of the Federal Register 12 13 shall prepare and publish the codifications, supplements, collations, indices, and user aids authorized by this sec-14 15 tion.

16 "(e) PRIMA FACIE EVIDENCE.—The codified documents of the several agencies published in the Code of 17 18 Federal Regulations under this section, as amended by documents subsequently filed with the Office and pub-19 lished in the daily issues of the Federal Register, shall 20 21 be prima facie evidence of the text of the documents and of the fact that they are in effect on and after the date 22 23 of publication.

"(f) REGULATIONS.—The Administrative Committee,
 with approval of the President, shall issue regulations for
 carrying out this section.

4 "(g) EXCEPTION.—This section does not require
5 codification of the text of Presidential documents pub6 lished and periodically compiled in supplements to title 3
7 of the Code of Federal Regulations.".

8 (h) TECHNICAL AND CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—
9 The table of sections for chapter 15 of title 44, United
10 States Code, is amended by striking the items related to
11 sections 1502, 1503, and 1504 and inserting the following:
"1502. Custody and publishing of Federal documents; appointment of Director.
"1503. Filing documents with Office; notation of time; public inspection; transmission for publishing.
"1504. 'Federal Register'; publishing; contents; distribution; price.''.

### 12 SEC. 3. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.

The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010, shall be determined by reference to the latest statement titled "Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation" for this Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record by the Chairman of the House Budget Committee, provided that such statement has been submitted prior to the vote on passage.
