4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Comptroller General of the
5 United States shall conduct a review of the public trans6 portation security assistance grant program under section
7 1406 of the Implementing Recommendations of the 9/11
8 Commission Act of 2007 (6 U.S.C. 1135; Public Law
9 110–53).

10 (b) SCOPE.—The review required under paragraph11 (1) shall include the following:

(1) An assessment of the type of projects funded under the public transportation security grant
program referred to in such paragraph.

(2) An assessment of the manner in which such
projects address threats to public transportation infrastructure.

(3) An assessment of the impact, if any, of this
Act (including the amendments made by this Act) on
types of projects funded under the public transportation security assistance grant program.

(4) An assessment of the management and administration of public transportation security assistance grant program funds by grantees.

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(5) Recommendations to improve the manner in
 which public transportation security assistance grant
 program funds address vulnerabilities in public
 transportation infrastructure.

5 (6) Recommendations to improve the manage6 ment and administration of the public transportation
7 security assistance grant program.

8 (c) REPORT.—Not later than one year after the date 9 of the enactment of this Act and again not later than five 10 years after such date of enactment, the Comptroller Gen-11 eral shall submit to the Committee on Homeland Security 12 of the House of Representatives and the Committee on 13 Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs of the Sen-14 ate a report on the review required under this section.

### 15 SEC. 5. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.

16 The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010, 17 shall be determined by reference to the latest statement 18 titled "Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation" for this 19 Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record 20 21 by the Chairman of the Committee on the Budget of the 22 House of Representatives, provided that such statement has been submitted prior to the vote on passage. 23
