A BILL

- To amend title 38, United States Code, to direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to make grants to entities that provide legal services for homeless veterans and veterans at risk for homelessness, and for other purposes.

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Legal Services for
- 5 Homeless Veterans Act".

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1SEC. 2. LEGAL SERVICES FOR HOMELESS VETERANS AND2VETERANS AT RISK FOR HOMELESSNESS.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 20 of title 38, United
4 States Code, is amended by inserting after section 2022
5 the following new section:

6 "§ 2022A. Legal services for homeless veterans and 7 veterans at risk for homelessness

8 "(a) GRANTS.—Subject to the availability of appro-9 priations provided for such purpose, the Secretary of Vet-10 erans Affairs shall make grants to eligible entities that 11 provide legal services to homeless veterans and veterans 12 at risk for homelessness.

13 "(b) CRITERIA.—(1) The Secretary shall—

"(A) establish criteria and requirements for
grants under this section, including criteria for entities eligible to receive such grants; and

17 "(B) publish such criteria and requirements in18 the Federal Register.

19 "(2) In establishing criteria and requirements under20 paragraph (1), the Secretary shall—

"(A) take into consideration any criteria and
requirements needed with respect to carrying out
this section in rural communities, Tribal lands, and
the territories and possessions of the United States;
and

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"(B) consult with organizations that have expe rience in providing services to homeless veterans, in cluding veterans service organizations, the Equal
 Justice Works AmeriCorps Veterans Legal Corps,
 and other organizations the Secretary determines
 appropriate.

7 "(c) ELIGIBLE ENTITIES.—The Secretary may make
8 a grant under this section to an entity applying for such
9 a grant only if the applicant for the grant—

"(1) is a public or nonprofit private entity with
the capacity (as determined by the Secretary) to effectively administer a grant under this section;

"(2) demonstrates that adequate financial support will be available to carry out the services for
which the grant is sought consistent with the application;

17 "(3) agrees to meet the applicable criteria and
18 requirements established under subsection (b)(1);
19 and

20 "(4) has, as determined by the Secretary, dem21 onstrated the capacity to meet such criteria and re22 quirements.

23 "(d) USE OF FUNDS.—Grants under this section
24 shall be used to provide homeless veterans and veterans
25 at risk for homelessness the following legal services:

1	"(1) Legal services related to housing, including
2	eviction defense, representation in landlord-tenant
3	cases, and representation in foreclosure cases.
4	"(2) Legal services related to family law, in-
5	cluding assistance in court proceedings for child sup-
6	port, divorce, estate planning, and family reconcili-
7	ation.
8	"(3) Legal services related to income support,
9	including assistance in obtaining public benefits.
10	"(4) Legal services related to criminal defense,
11	including defense in matters symptomatic of home-
12	lessness, such as outstanding warrants, fines, and
13	driver's license revocation, to reduce recidivism and
14	facilitate the overcoming of reentry obstacles in em-
15	ployment or housing.
16	"(5) Legal services related to requests to up-
17	grade the characterization of a discharge or dis-
18	missal of a former member of the Armed Forces
19	under section 1553 of title 10.
20	"(6) Such other legal services as the Secretary
21	determines appropriate.
22	"(e) Funds for Women Veterans.—For any fiscal
23	year, not less than ten percent of the amount authorized
24	to be appropriated for grants under this section shall be

used to provide legal services described in subsection (d)
 to women veterans.

- 3 "(f) REPORTS.—On a biennial basis, the Secretary 4 shall submit to the Committees on Veterans' Affairs of 5 the House of Representatives and the Senate a report on 6 grants under this section. To the extent feasible, each such 7 report shall include the following with respect to the year 8 covered by the report:
- 9 "(1) The number of homeless veterans and vet10 erans at risk for homelessness assisted.

11 "(2) A description of the legal services pro-12 vided.

13 "(3) A description of the legal matters ad-14 dressed.

15 "(4) An analysis by the Secretary with respect
16 to the operational effectiveness and cost-effectiveness
17 of the services provided.".

(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
at the beginning of such chapter is amended by inserting
after the item relating to section 2022 the following new
item:

"2022A. Legal services for homeless veterans and veterans at risk for homelessness.".

(c) CRITERIA.—Not later than 180 days after the
date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall establish the criteria and requirements

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in the Federal Register pursuant to subsection (b)(1) of
 section 2022A of title 38, United States Code, as added
 by subsection (a).

4 SEC. 3. ADDITIONAL AMOUNT FOR SUPPORTIVE SERVICES 5 FOR VETERAN FAMILIES GRANT PROGRAM 6 TO SUPPORT ORGANIZATIONS THAT HAVE A 7 FOCUS ON PROVIDING ASSISTANCE TO 8 WOMEN VETERANS AND THEIR FAMILIES.

9 Section 2044(e) of title 38, United States Code, is
10 amended by adding at the end the following new para11 graph:

"(4) There is authorized to be appropriated
\$20,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2022 through
2024 for the provision of financial assistance under
subsection (a) to organizations that have a focus on
providing assistance to women veterans and their
families.".

18 SEC. 4. GAP ANALYSIS OF DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AF-

19FAIRS PROGRAMS THAT PROVIDE ASSIST-20ANCE TO WOMEN VETERANS WHO ARE HOME-21LESS.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs
shall complete an analysis of programs of the Department
of Veterans Affairs that provide assistance to women veterans who are homeless or precariously housed to identify

the areas in which such programs are failing to meet the
 needs of such women.

3 (b) REPORT.—Not later than 270 days after the date 4 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit 5 to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and 6 the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the House of Rep-7 resentatives a report on the analysis completed under sub-8 section (a).
