A BILL

To direct the Attorney General to amend certain regulations so that practitioners may administer not more than 3 days' medication to a person at one time when administering narcotic drugs for the purpose of relieving acute withdrawal symptoms.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. 4 This Act may be cited as the "Easy Medication Access and Treatment for Opioid Addiction Act" or the "Easy MAT for Opioid Addiction Act". 6 SEC. 2. DISPENSATION OF NARCOTIC DRUGS FOR THE PUR-8 POSE OF RELIEVING ACUTE WITHDRAWAL 9 SYMPTOMS FROM OPIOID USE DISORDER. 10 Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Attorney General shall revise section 11 1306.07(b) of title 21, Code of Federal Regulations, so that practitioners, in accordance with applicable State, Federal, or local laws relating to controlled substances, are allowed to dispense not more than a three-day supply of narcotic drugs to one person or for one person's use at one time for
