A BILL

To amend the Controlled Substances Act to authorize the debarment of certain registrants, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Debarment Enforcement
5 of Bad Actor Registrants Act of 2020" or the "DEBAR Act
6 of 2020".

7 SEC. 2. DEBARMENT OF CERTAIN REGISTRANTS.

8 Section 304 of the Controlled Substances Act (21 9 U.S.C. 824) is amended by adding at the end the following: 10 "(h) The Attorney General may issue an order to prohibit, conditionally or unconditionally, and permanently or 11 for such period as the Attorney General may determine, any 12 person from being registered under this title to manufac-13 ture, distribute, or dispense a controlled substance or a list 14 15 I chemical, if the Attorney General finds that—

"(1) such person meets or has met any of the
conditions for suspension or revocation of registration
under subsection (a); and

19 "(2) such person has a history of prior suspen20 sions or revocations of registration.".
