MODIFICATION, TRANSFER, AND TERMINATION OF 4 5 REGISTRATION TO MANUFACTURE, DIS-6 TRIBUTE, OR DISPENSE CONTROLLED SUB-7 STANCES. 8 Subsection (a) of section 302 of the Controlled Sub-9 stances Act (21 U.S.C. 822) is amended by adding at the end the following new paragraph: 10 11 "(3)(A) Except as provided in subparagraph (C), the registration of any registrant under this title to manufacture, distribute, or dispense controlled substances or list 13 I chemicals terminates if and when such registrant— "(i) dies: 15 16 "(ii) ceases legal existence; "(iii) discontinues business or professional prac-17 18 tice; or 19 "(iv) surrenders such registration.
