## A BILL

To prohibit Russian participation in the G7, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON RUSSIAN PARTICIPATION IN
- 4 THE G7.
- 5 (a) LIMITATION.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
- 6 sion of law, no Federal funds are authorized to be appro-
- 7 priated to take any action to support or facilitate—

1	(1) the participation of Russia in a Group of
2	Seven proceeding; or
3	(2) the reconstitution of the Group of Eight to
4	include Russia.
5	(b) Termination.—Subsection (a) shall cease to
6	have any force or effect after the date on which—
7	(1) the Secretary of State and the Director of
8	National Intelligence, in consultation with the Sec-
9	retary of Homeland Security and the Director of the
10	Federal Bureau of Investigation, certify to the ap-
11	propriate congressional committees and leadership
12	that the Government of Russia, and all persons act-
13	ing as an agent of or otherwise on behalf of such
14	government, has halted all interference in United
15	States elections or elections of the other members of
16	the Group of Seven, members of the North Atlantic
17	Treaty Organization (NATO) and the European
18	Union, and other allies and partners; and
19	(2) the Secretary of State, in consultation with
20	the Director of National Intelligence, determines and
21	certifies to the appropriate congressional committees
22	and leadership that the Government of Russia, and
23	all persons acting as an agent of or otherwise on be-
24	half of such government, has—

1	(A) ended its illegal occupation of Crimea
2	and is fully complying with its commitments
3	under the Minsk agreement with respect to
4	Eastern Ukraine;
5	(B) ended its illegal occupation of South
6	Ossetia and Abkhazia and will support efforts
7	for the reintegration of these regions with the
8	Republic of Georgia; and
9	(C) withdrawn its troops and armaments
10	from Transnistria and fully respects Moldova's
11	sovereignty and territorial integrity.
12	(c) Report.—Not later than 60 days after the date
13	of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of State, in
14	coordination with the Director of National Intelligence
15	and in consultation with the heads of other relevant Fed-
16	eral departments and agencies, shall submit to the appro-
17	priate congressional committees and leadership a report
18	on the threats and challenges of Russia to NATO and the
19	United States in Afghanistan and to United States efforts
20	to counter such threats and challenges, including—
21	(1) an assessment of support provided by the
22	Government of Russia, and all persons acting as an
23	agent of or otherwise on behalf of such government,
24	for Taliban-linked militants, including—

1	(A) the provision of defense articles, de-
2	fense services, or technology (as such terms are
3	defined and described in the Arms Export Con-
4	trol Act (22 U.S.C. 2751 et seq.)) or financial
5	assistance for purposes that undermine or run
6	counter to the principles agreed upon in the
7	Agreement for Bringing Peace to Afghanistan
8	entered into on February 29, 2020;
9	(B) financial transactions, including trans-
10	actions made through the hawala system, be-
11	tween the individuals and entities of the Gov-
12	ernment of Russia, or individuals or entities
13	acting in connection with that government, to
14	Taliban-linked militants, other militants with
15	connections to Afghanistan, and their inter-
16	mediaries; and
17	(C) any alleged program to incentivize the
18	killing of United States or NATO coalition sol-
19	diers by the Government of Russia or any other
20	foreign government;
21	(2) a description of United States Government
22	efforts to engage in diplomatic efforts with Russia
23	and the governments of NATO coalition allies and
24	partners to counter Russian malign influence in Af-
25	ghanistan; and

1	(3) a description of the views of the govern-
2	ments of other NATO members, including heads of
3	government, political leaders, and military com-
4	manders in the region on Russian interference and
5	malign influence in Afghanistan.
6	(d) Appropriate Congressional Committees
7	AND LEADERSHIP.—In this section, the term "appropriate
8	congressional committees and leadership" means—
9	(1) the Committee on Foreign Affairs, the Per-
10	manent Select Committee on Intelligence, the Com-
11	mittee on Homeland Security, and the Speaker, the
12	majority leader, and the minority leader of the
13	House of Representatives; and
14	(2) the Committee on Foreign Relations, the
15	Select Committee on Intelligence, the Committee on
16	Homeland Security, and the majority leader and the
17	minority leader of the Senate.
