

Suspend the Rules and Pass the Bill, H.R. 7489, With an Amendment

(The amendment strikes all after the enacting clause and inserts a new text)

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to convey to the Commonwealth of Virginia or the District of Columbia certain Federal land under the administrative jurisdiction of the National Park Service for the construction of rail and other infrastructure, and for other purposes.

A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to convey to the Commonwealth of Virginia or the District of Columbia certain Federal land under the administrative jurisdiction of the National Park Service for the construction of rail and other infrastructure, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Long Bridge Act of
3 2020”.

4 **SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF CONVEYANCES.**

5 (a) CONVEYANCES AUTHORIZED.—On request of the
6 Commonwealth of Virginia or the District of Columbia,
7 as applicable, the Secretary of the Interior may, subject
8 to any terms and conditions that the Secretary determines
9 to be necessary, convey to the Commonwealth of Virginia
10 or the District of Columbia, as applicable, any Federal
11 land or interest in Federal land under the jurisdiction of
12 the Secretary that is identified by the Commonwealth of
13 Virginia or the District of Columbia, as applicable, as nec-
14 essary for the Long Bridge Project.

15 (b) REVERSION.—If any portion of the Federal land
16 or interest in Federal land conveyed under subsection (a)
17 is no longer being used for railroad purposes or rec-
18 reational use, title to the portion of the Federal land or
19 interest in the portion of the Federal land shall revert to
20 the Secretary, on a determination by the Secretary that
21 the portion of the Federal land has been remediated and
22 restored to a condition determined to be satisfactory by
23 the Secretary.

24 (c) TEMPORARY USE.—The Secretary may allow the
25 temporary use of any Federal land under the jurisdiction
26 of the Secretary that is identified by the Commonwealth

1 of Virginia or the District of Columbia, as applicable, as
2 necessary for the construction of the Long Bridge Project,
3 subject to any terms and conditions determined to be nec-
4 essary by the Secretary.

5 (d) RECOVERY OF COSTS.—Notwithstanding any
6 other provision of law, the Secretary may recover from the
7 Commonwealth of Virginia or the District of Columbia,
8 as applicable, all costs incurred by the Secretary in pro-
9 viding or procuring necessary services associated with a
10 conveyance under subsection (a) or use authorized under
11 subsection (c), with such amounts to remain available to
12 the Secretary until expended, without further appropria-
13 tion.

14 (e) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

15 (1) LONG BRIDGE PROJECT.—The term “Long
16 Bridge Project” means the project consisting of im-
17 provements to the Long Bridge and related railroad
18 infrastructure between Rosslyn (RO) Interlocking in
19 Arlington, Virginia, and L’Enfant (LE) Interlocking
20 near 10th Street SW in the District of Columbia,
21 the purpose of which is to expand commuter and re-
22 gional passenger rail service and provide bicycle and
23 pedestrian access crossings over the Potomac River.

1 (2) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
2 the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Di-
3 rector of the National Park Service.

4 **SEC. 3. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.**

5 The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of
6 complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010,
7 shall be determined by reference to the latest statement
8 titled “Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation” for this
9 Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record
10 by the Chairman of the House Budget Committee, pro-
11 vided that such statement has been submitted prior to the
12 vote on passage.
