- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- This Act may be cited as the "Debarment Enforce-
- 5 ment of Bad Actor Registrants Act of 2021" or the
- 6 "DEBAR Act of 2021".

## 1 SEC. 2. DEBARMENT OF CERTAIN REGISTRANTS.

- 2 Section 304 of the Controlled Substances Act (21
- 3 U.S.C. 824) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
- 4 lowing:
- 5 "(h) The Attorney General may issue an order to pro-
- 6 hibit, conditionally or unconditionally, and permanently or
- 7 for such period as the Attorney General may determine,
- 8 any person from being registered under this title to manu-
- 9 facture, distribute, or dispense a controlled substance or
- 10 a list I chemical, if the Attorney General finds that—
- "(1) such person meets or has met any of the
- conditions for suspension or revocation of registra-
- tion under subsection (a); and
- 14 "(2) such person has a history of prior suspen-
- sions or revocations of registration.".
