A BILL

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS.
- 4 The Congress finds the following:
- 5 (1) At 9:44 A.M., on August 26, 2021, the
- 6 Pentagon confirmed that one explosion occurred at
- 7 the Hamid Karzai International Airport.

1	(2) The explosion was confirmed to be a suicide
2	bombing by ISIS-K terrorist group.
3	(3) Estimates as high as 200 deaths were re-
4	ported, including 13 servicemembers of the United
5	States, as well as hundreds more wounded.
6	(4) The attack on Thursday, August 26, 2021,
7	at the Hamid Karzai International Airport in Kabul,
8	Afghanistan, killed 13 United States
9	servicemembers, making it the deadliest single day
10	of the war for the United States in more than a dec-
11	ade.
12	(5) The American servicemembers went above
13	and beyond the call of duty to protect citizens of the
14	United States and our allies to ensure they are
15	brought to safety in an extremely dangerous situa-
16	tion as the Taliban regained control over Afghani-
17	stan.
18	(6) The American servicemembers exemplified
19	extreme bravery and valor against armed enemy
20	combatants.
21	(7) The American servicemembers dedicated
22	their lives and their heroism deserves great honor.
23	(8) Maxton Soviak, Kareem Nikoui, David
24	Espinoza, Rylee McCollum, Jared Schmitz, Hunter
25	Lopez, Taylor Hoover, Daegan William-Tyeler Page,

1	Nicole Gee, Humberto Sanchez, Dylan Merola,
2	Johanny Rosario Pichardo, and Ryan Knauss have
3	been identified as the 13 servicemembers who died
4	from the blast while stationed at Hamid Karzai
5	International Airport.
6	SEC. 2. CONGRESSIONAL GOLD MEDALS.
7	(a) Presentations Authorized.—The Speaker of
8	the House of Representatives and the President pro tem-
9	pore of the Senate shall make appropriate arrangements
10	for the posthumous presentation, on behalf of the Con-
11	gress, of a single gold medal of appropriate design in com-
12	memoration to the 13 servicemembers who perished in Af-
13	ghanistan, on August 26, 2021.
14	(b) Design and Striking.—For the purposes of the
15	presentation referred to in subsection (a), the Secretary
16	of the Treasury (hereafter in this Act referred to as the
17	"Secretary") shall strike a gold medal with suitable em-
18	blems, devices, and inscriptions, to be determined by the
19	Secretary.
20	(c) Smithsonian Institution.—
21	(1) In general.—Following the award of the
22	gold medal under subsection (a), the gold medal
23	shall be given to the Smithsonian Institution, where
24	it shall be available for display as appropriate and
25	made available for research.

(2) Sense of congress.—It is the sense of

2	Congress that the Smithsonian Institution shall
3	make the gold medal received under paragraph (1)
4	available for display outside of the District of Co-
5	lumbia at times, particularly at other locations asso-
6	ciated with the 13 servicemembers who perished in
7	Afghanistan on August 26, 2021.
8	SEC. 3. DUPLICATE MEDALS.
9	The Secretary may strike and sell duplicates in
10	bronze of the gold medal struck pursuant to section 2 at
11	a price sufficient to cover the cost thereof, including labor,
12	materials, dies, use of machinery, and overhead expenses.
13	SEC. 4. STATUS OF MEDALS.
14	(a) National Medals.—The medal struck pursuant
15	to this Act is a national medal for purposes of chapter
16	51 of title 31, United States Code.
17	(b) Numismatic Items.—For purposes of section
18	5134 of title 31, United States Code, all medals struck
19	under this Act shall be considered to be numismatic items.
20	SEC. 5. AUTHORITY TO USE FUND AMOUNTS; PROCEEDS OF
21	SALE.
22	(a) AUTHORITY TO USE FUND AMOUNTS.—There is
23	authorized to be charged against the United States Mint
24	Public Enterprise Fund such amounts as may be nec-

- 1 essary to pay for the costs of the medals struck pursuant
- 2 to this Act.
- 3 (b) Proceeds of Sale.—The amounts received
- 4 from the sale of duplicate bronze medals authorized under
- 5 section 3 shall be deposited into the United States Mint
- 6 Public Enterprise Fund.

7 SEC. 6. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.

- 8 The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of
- 9 complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010,
- 10 shall be determined by reference to the latest statement
- 11 titled "Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation" for this
- 12 Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record
- 13 by the Chairman of the House Budget Committee, pro-
- 14 vided that such statement has been submitted prior to the
- 15 vote on passage.
