The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution
____, by a record vote of 7 to 3, report the same to the House with the
recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 3807, the Relief for Restaurants and other Hard Hit Small Businesses Act of 2022, under a closed rule. The resolution provides one hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on Small Business or their designees. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The resolution provides that an amendment in the nature of a substitute consisting of the text of Rules Committee Print 117-39, modified by the amendment printed in this report, shall be considered as adopted and the bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the bill, as amended. The resolution provides one motion to recommit.

EXPLANATION OF WAIVERS

The waiver of all points of order against consideration of the bill includes a waiver of clause 12 of rule XXI, which prohibits consideration of a bill pursuant to a special order of business reported by the Committee on Rules that has not been reported by a committee.

Although the resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the bill, as amended, the Committee is not aware of any points of order.

The waiver is prophylactic in nature.

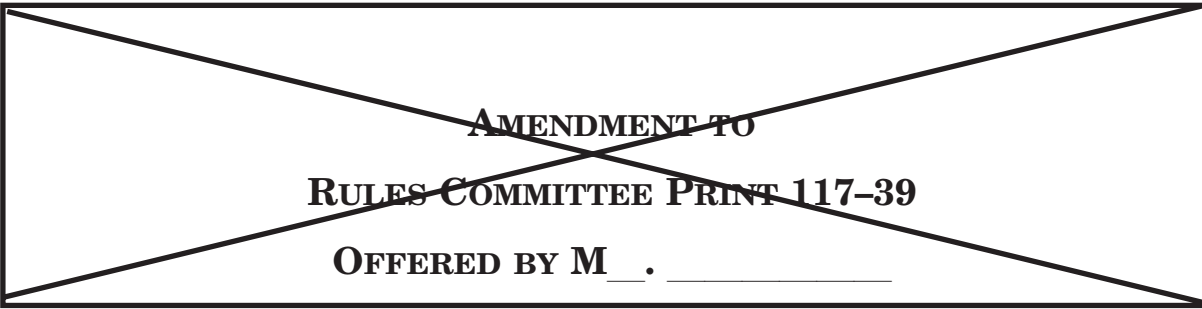

SUMMARY OF THE AMENDMENT TO H.R. 3807 CONSIDERED AS
ADOPTED

1. Velázquez (NY): Makes technical and conforming changes to the bill, as well as clarifies eligibility for small business concerns owned and controlled by members of Tribes, Alaska Native Corporation, or Native Hawaiian Organization and ineligible businesses for the Hard-Hit Industries Award Program.

Page 12, line 13, strike the period at the end and insert “; or”.

Page 12, after line 13, insert the following:

Page 17, strike lines 1 through 6 and insert the following:

3 (12) SMALL BUSINESS CONCERN.—The term
4 “small business concern” has the meaning given
5 under section 3 of the Small Business Act (15
6 U.S.C. 632) and includes—

7 (A) individuals who operate under a sole
8 proprietorship, as an independent contractor, or
9 as an eligible self-employed individual; and

Page 19, line 2, strike “60” and insert “120”.

Page 21, line 16, strike “shall” and insert “may”.

Page 21, line 19, after “subparagraphs” insert “and
in accordance with paragraph (2)(D)”.

Page 21, beginning on line 19, strike “an equal”
and insert “a”.

Page 21, line 22, after “subparagraphs” insert “and
in accordance with paragraph (2)(D)”.

Strike subsection (d) of section 3 and redesignate
the following subsections accordingly.

Page 31, line 11, strike “30” and insert “90”.

Page 33, line 1, strike “means any funds”.

Page 33, line 2, strike “reseeded” and insert “re-
covered”.
