2 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. 2 This Act may be cited as the "Access for Veterans 3 to Records Act of 2022". SEC. 2. PLAN TO ELIMINATE RECORDS BACKLOG AT THE 4 5 NATIONAL PERSONNEL RECORDS CENTER. 6 (a) Plan Required.—Not later than 60 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Archivist of the 8 United States shall submit to the appropriate congres-9 sional committees a comprehensive plan for reducing the backlog of requests for records from the National Per-10 11 sonnel Records Center and improving the efficiency and responsiveness of operations at the National Personnel 13 Records Center, that includes, at a minimum, the following: 14 15 (1) An estimate of the number of backlogged 16 record requests for veterans. 17 (2) Target timeframes to reduce the backlog. 18 (3) A detailed plan for using existing funds to 19 improve the information technology infrastructure, 20 including secure access to appropriate agency Fed-21 eral records, to prevent future backlogs. 22 (4) Actions to improve customer service for re-23 questers.

24 (5) Measurable goals with respect to the com-25 prehensive plan and metrics for tracking progress 26 toward such goals.
