A BILL

To amend the Public Health Service Act to provide for research and improvement of cardiovascular health among the South Asian population of the United States, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. 4 This Act may be cited as the "South Asian Heart 5 Health Awareness and Research Act of 2022". SEC. 2. HEART HEALTH PROMOTION GRANTS. 6 7 Title III of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 8 241 et seq.) is amended by inserting after section 317U (42) 9 U.S.C. 247b–23) the following new section: 10 "SEC. 317V. HEART HEALTH PROMOTION GRANTS.

11 "(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may make grants 12 to States for the purpose of promoting awareness of the in-13 creasing prevalence of heart disease, including, where ap-14 propriate, its relationship to type 2 diabetes, in commu-15 nities disproportionately affected by heart disease such as 16 South Asian communities in the United States.

17 "(b) USE OF FUNDS.—A State that receives a grant
18 under subsection (a) shall use such grant funds—

"(1) to develop culturally appropriate materials
on evidence-based heart health promotion topics, such
as nutrition education, optimal diet plans, and programs for regular exercise;

23 "(2) to support heart health promotion activities
24 of community organizations that work with or serve
25 communities disproportionately affected by heart dis-

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ease, such as South Asian communities in the United
 States; or

3 "(3) to support, with respect to research con4 ducted relating to heart disease, conferences and work5 shops on how practices, methodologies, and designs of
6 such research should be changed to include in such re7 search more members of communities disproportion8 ately affected by heart disease, such as South Asian
9 communities in the United States.

10 "(c) ANNUAL REPORT TO CONGRESS.—Not later than
11 180 days after the date of the enactment of the South Asian
12 Heart Health Awareness and Research Act of 2022, and an13 nually thereafter, the Secretary shall submit to Congress a
14 report on outreach efforts and data relating to heart disease
15 in communities disproportionately affected by heart disease,
16 such as South Asian communities in the United States.

17 "(d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—For pur18 poses of carrying out this section, there is authorized to be
19 appropriated \$1,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2023
20 through 2027.".

21 SEC. 3. HEART HEALTH RESEARCH.

22 Part B of title IV of the Public Health Service Act
23 (42 U.S.C. 284 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end
24 the following new section:

1 "SEC. 409K. HEART HEALTH RESEARCH.

2 "(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may—

3 "(1) conduct or support research and related ac4 tivities regarding cardiovascular disease, type 2 dia5 betes, and other heart health-related ailments among
6 at-risk populations, including South Asian commu7 nities in the United States; and

8 "(2) establish an internet clearinghouse to cata-9 log existing evidence-based heart health research and 10 treatment options for communities disproportionately 11 affected by heart disease, such as South Asian com-12 munities in the United States, to prevent, treat, or re-13 verse heart disease and diabetes.

"(b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—For purposes of carrying out this section, there is authorized to be
appropriated \$1,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2023
through 2027.".
