

PROVIDING FOR CONSIDERATION OF THE BILL (H.R. 263) TO AMEND THE LACEY ACT AMENDMENTS OF 1981 TO CLARIFY PROVISIONS ENACTED BY THE CAPTIVE WILDLIFE SAFETY ACT, TO FURTHER THE CONSERVATION OF CERTAIN WILDLIFE SPECIES, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, AND PROVIDING FOR CONSIDERATION OF THE BILL (H.R. 4040) TO AMEND TITLE XVIII OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT TO EXTEND TELEHEALTH FLEXIBILITIES UNDER THE MEDICARE PROGRAM, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution ____, by a record vote of 8 to 4, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 263, the Big Cat Public Safety Act, under a structured rule. The resolution provides one hour of general debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on Natural Resources or their designees. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The resolution provides that the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on Natural Resources now printed in the bill shall be considered as adopted and the bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the bill, as amended. The resolution makes in order the further amendment printed in part A of this report, if offered by the Member designated in this report, which shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time specified in the report equally divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent, and shall not be subject to a demand for

division of the question. The resolution waives all points of order against the amendment printed in this report. The resolution provides one motion to recommit. The resolution further provides for consideration of H.R. 4040, the Advancing Telehealth Beyond COVID–19 Act of 2022, under a closed rule. The resolution provides one hour of general debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on Energy and Commerce or their designees. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The resolution provides that an amendment in the nature of a substitute consisting of the text of Rules Committee Print 117-59, modified by the amendment printed in part B of this report, shall be considered as adopted and the bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the bill, as amended. The resolution provides one motion to recommit. The resolution provides that House Resolution 517 is hereby adopted.

1. Huffman (CA): Requires the Secretary of the Interior to submit a report to Congress on the implementation of this Act. (10 minutes)

SUMMARY OF THE AMENDMENT TO H.R. 4040 IN PART B
CONSIDERED AS ADOPTED

1. Pallone (NJ): Changes the amount in the Medicare Improvement Fund to \$5.153 billion and makes technical changes.

PART A—TEXT OF AMENDMENT TO H.R. 263 MADE IN ORDER

1. AN AMENDMENT TO BE OFFERED BY REPRESENTATIVE HUFFMAN OF CALIFORNIA OR HIS DESIGNEE, DEBATABLE FOR 10 MINUTES

At the end of the bill, add the following:

SEC. 7. REPORT TO CONGRESS.

Not later than 2 years after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of the Interior shall submit to the Committee on Natural Resources of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Environment and Public Works of the Senate a report describing the number and species of big cats registered under section 3(e)(2)(E) of the Lacey Act Amendments of 1981 (16 U.S.C. 3372)(3)(e)(2)(E) (as added by this Act) and the status of any implementing regulations under section 7(a)(3) of such Act (16 U.S.C. 3376(a)(3)) (as added by this Act).

PART B—TEXT OF AMENDMENT TO H.R. 4040 CONSIDERED AS
ADOPTED
