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## A BILL

To authorize the National Service Animals Monument Corporation to establish a commemorative work in the District of Columbia and its environs, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “National Service Ani-  
5 mals Memorial Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION TO ESTABLISH COMMEMORATIVE**  
2 **WORK.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The National Service Animals  
4 Monument Corporation (referred to in this section as the  
5 “Corporation”) may establish a commemorative work on  
6 Federal land in the District of Columbia and its environs  
7 to commemorate the heroic deeds and sacrifices of service  
8 animals and handlers of service animals in the United  
9 States.

10 (b) COMPLIANCE WITH STANDARDS FOR COMMEMO-  
11 RATIVE WORKS.—The establishment of the commemora-  
12 tive work under this section shall be in accordance with  
13 chapter 89 of title 40, United States Code (commonly  
14 known as the “Commemorative Works Act”).

15 (c) PROHIBITION ON THE USE OF FEDERAL  
16 FUNDS.—

17 (1) IN GENERAL.—Federal funds may not be  
18 used to pay any expense of the establishment of the  
19 commemorative work under this section.

20 (2) RESPONSIBILITY OF THE NATIONAL SERV-  
21 ICE ANIMALS MONUMENT CORPORATION.—The Cor-  
22 poration shall be solely responsible for the accept-  
23 ance of contributions for, and the payment of the ex-  
24 penses of, the establishment of the commemorative  
25 work under this section.

26 (d) DEPOSIT OF EXCESS FUNDS.—

1           (1) IN GENERAL.—If, upon payment of all ex-  
2           penses for the establishment of the commemorative  
3           work under this section (including the maintenance  
4           and preservation amount required by section  
5           8906(b)(1) of title 40, United States Code), there  
6           remains a balance of funds received for the estab-  
7           lishment of the commemorative work, the Corpora-  
8           tion shall transmit the amount of the balance to the  
9           Secretary of the Interior for deposit in the account  
10          provided for in section 8906(b)(3) of title 40, United  
11          States Code.

12          (2) ON EXPIRATION OF AUTHORITY.—If, upon  
13          expiration of the authority for the commemorative  
14          work under section 8903(e) of title 40, United  
15          States Code, there remains a balance of funds re-  
16          ceived for the establishment of the commemorative  
17          work under this section, the Corporation shall trans-  
18          mit the amount of the balance to a separate account  
19          with the National Park Foundation for memorials,  
20          to be available to the Secretary of the Interior or the  
21          Administrator of General Services, as appropriate, in  
22          accordance with the process provided in section  
23          8906(b)(4) of title 40, United States Code, for ac-  
24          counts established under paragraph (2) or (3) of  
25          section 8906(b) of such title.

1 **SEC. 3. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.**

2       The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of  
3 complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010,  
4 shall be determined by reference to the latest statement  
5 titled “Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation” for this  
6 Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record  
7 by the Chairman of the House Budget Committee, pro-  
8 vided that such statement has been submitted prior to the  
9 vote on passage.
