Mr. GRIJALVA introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Education and Labor, and in addition to the Committee on Natural Resources, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

To reauthorize the Morris K. Udall and Stewart L. Udall
Trust Fund, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. FUNDING REAUTHORIZATION.**

4 Section 13 of the Morris K. Udall and Stewart L.
5 Udall Foundation Act (20 U.S.C. 5609) is amended—

1 (1) by striking “through 2023” each place it
2 appears and inserting “through 2029”;

3 (2) in subsection (b)(1), by striking “\$1,000”
4 and inserting “\$5,000”; and

5 (3) in subsection (c), by striking “the fiscal
6 year in which this subsection is enacted” and insert-
7 ing “fiscal year 2022”.

8 **SEC. 2. AUDIT OF THE FOUNDATION.**

9 The Morris K. Udall and Stewart L. Udall Founda-
10 tion Act (20 U.S.C. 5609) is amended by inserting at the
11 end the following—

12 **“SEC. 14. AUDIT OF THE FOUNDATION.**

13 “Not later than 4 years after the date of enactment
14 of this section, the Inspector General of the Department
15 of the Interior shall conduct an audit of the Morris K.
16 Udall and Stewart L. Udall Foundation.”.

17 **SEC. 3. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.**

18 The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of
19 complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010,
20 shall be determined by reference to the latest statement
21 titled “Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation” for this
22 Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record
23 by the Chairman of the House Budget Committee, pro-
24 vided that such statement has been submitted prior to the
25 vote on passage.
