All 5 points of order against consideration of the bill are waived. 6 In lieu of the amendment in the nature of a substitute 7 recommended by the Committee on Natural Resources 8 now printed in the bill, an amendment in the nature of 9 a substitute consisting of the text of Rules Committee 10 Print 117-74 shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. All points of order 11 12 against provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the 13 bill, as amended, and on any further amendment thereto, 14 15 to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair 16 17 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Nat-18 ural Resources or their respective designees; and (2) one 19 motion to recommit.
