## A BILL

To extend the Gabriella Miller Kids First Pediatric Research Program at the National Institutes of Health, and for other purposes.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
This Act may be cited as the "Gabriella Miller Kids
First Research Act 2.0".
SEC. 2. FUNDING FOR THE PEDIATRIC RESEARCH INITIA-
TIVE.
The Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 201 et seq.)
is amended—
(1) in section $402A(a)(2)$ (42 U.S.C.
282a(a)(2))—
(A) in the heading—
(i) by striking "10-YEAR"; and
(ii) by striking "Through common
FUND";
(B) by striking "to the Common Fund" and
inserting "to the Division of Program Coordina-
tion, Planning, and Strategic Initiatives";
(C) by striking "10-Year";
(D) by striking "and reserved under sub-
section $(c)(1)(B)(i)$ of this section"; and
(E) by striking "2014 through 2023" and
inserting "2024 through 2028";
(2) in each of paragraphs $(1)(A)$ and $(2)(C)$ of
section 402A(c) (42 U.S.C. 282a(c)), by striking "sec-

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1	tion $402(b)(7)(B)$ " and inserting "section
2	402(b)(7)(B)(i)"; and
3	(3) in section $402(b)(7)(B)(ii)$ (42 U.S.C.
4	282(b)(7)(B)(ii)), by striking "the Common Fund"
5	and inserting "the Division of Program Coordination,
6	Planning, and Strategic Initiatives".
7	SEC. 3. COORDINATION OF NIH FUNDING FOR PEDIATRIC
8	RESEARCH.
9	(a) Sense of Congress.—It is the sense of the Con-
10	gress that the Director of the National Institutes of Health
11	should continue to oversee and coordinate research that is
12	conducted or supported by the National Institutes of Health
13	for research on pediatric cancer and other pediatric diseases
14	and conditions, including through the Pediatric Research
15	Initiative Fund.
16	(b) Avoiding Duplication.—Section 402(b)(7)(B)(ii)
17	of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C.
18	282(b)(7)(B)(ii)) is amended by inserting "and shall
19	prioritize, as appropriate, such pediatric research that does
20	not duplicate existing research activities of the National In-
21	stitutes of Health" before "; and".
22	SEC. 4. REPORT ON PROGRESS AND INVESTMENTS IN PEDI-
23	ATRIC RESEARCH.
24	Not later than 5 years after the date of the enactment
25	of this Act, the Secretary of Health and Human Services

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shall submit to the Committee on Energy and Commerce
 of the House of Representatives and the Committee on
 Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions of the Senate a
 report that—
