To require the Director of the Office of Management and Budget to submit to Congress an annual report on projects that are over budget and behind schedule, and for other purposes.

3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Billion Dollar Boon-
5	doggle Act of 2023".
6	SEC. 2. ANNUAL REPORT.
7	(a) Definitions.—In this section—
8	(1) the term "covered agency" means—
9	(A) an Executive agency, as defined in sec-
10	tion 105 of title 5, United States Code; and
11	(B) an independent regulatory agency, as
12	defined in section 3502 of title 44, United
13	States Code;

1	(2) the term "covered project" means a project
2	funded by a covered agency—
3	(A) that is more than 5 years behind
4	schedule, as measured against the original ex-
5	pected date for completion; or
6	(B) for which the amount spent on the
7	project is not less than \$1,000,000,000 more
8	than the original cost estimate for the project;
9	and
10	(3) the term "project" means a major acquisi-
11	tion, a major defense acquisition program (as de-
12	fined in section 4201 of title 10, United States
13	Code), a procurement, a construction project, a re-
14	mediation or clean-up effort, or any other time-lim-
15	ited endeavor, that is not funded through direct
16	spending (as defined in section 250(c) of the Bal-
17	anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of
18	1985 (2 U.S.C. $900(c)$)).
19	(b) REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 1 year after the
20	date of enactment of this Act, the Director of the Office
21	of Management and Budget shall issue guidance requiring
22	covered agencies to include, on an annual basis in a report
23	described in paragraph (2) of section 3516(a) of title 31,
24	United States Code, or a consolidated report described in
25	paragraph (1) of such section, information relating to each

1	covered project of the covered agency, which shall in-
2	clude—
3	(1) a brief description of the covered project,
4	including—
5	(A) the purpose of the covered project;
6	(B) each location in which the covered
7	project is carried out;
8	(C) the contract or award number of the
9	covered project, where applicable;
10	(D) the year in which the covered project
11	was initiated;
12	(E) the Federal share of the total cost of
13	the covered project; and
14	(F) each primary contractor, subcon-
15	tractor, grant recipient, and subgrantee recipi-
16	ent of the covered project;
17	(2) an explanation of any change to the original
18	scope of the covered project, including by the addi-
19	tion or narrowing of the initial requirements of the
20	covered project;
21	(3) the original expected date for completion of
22	the covered project;
23	(4) the current expected date for completion of
24	the covered project;

1	(5) the original cost estimate for the covered
2	project, as adjusted to reflect increases in the Con-
3	sumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers, as
4	published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics;
5	(6) the current cost estimate for the covered
6	project, as adjusted to reflect increases in the Con-
7	sumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers, as
8	published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics;
9	(7) an explanation for a delay in completion or
10	an increase in the original cost estimate for the cov-
11	ered project, including, where applicable, any impact
12	of insufficient or delayed appropriations; and
13	(8) the amount of and rationale for any award,
14	incentive fee, or other type of bonus, if any, awarded
15	for the covered project.
16	(c) FORM.—If any information required under sub-
17	section (b) is classified, such information may be sub-
18	mitted in the form of a classified annex consistent with
19	the protection of sources and methods.
