Mr. Austin Scott of Georgia, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 471) to expedite under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and improve forest management activities on National Forest System lands, on public lands under the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Land Management, and on Tribal lands to return resilience to overgrown, fire-prone forested lands, and for other purposes, and providing for

consideration of the bill (S. 5) to require the Secretary of Homeland Security to take into custody aliens who have been charged in the United States with theft, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after adoption of this reso-
2 lution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule
3 XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of
4 the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 471) to expedite under the National
6 Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and improve forest
7 management activities on National Forest System lands,
8 on public lands under the jurisdiction of the Bureau of
9 Land Management, and on Tribal lands to return resil-
10 ience to overgrown, fire-prone forested lands, and for other
11 purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed
12 with. All points of order against consideration of the bill
13 are waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill
14 and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-
15 trolled by the chair and ranking minority member of the
16 Committee on Natural Resources or their respective des-
17 ignees. After general debate the bill shall be considered
18 for amendment under the five-minute rule. The bill shall
19 be considered as read. All points of order against provi-
20 sions in the bill are waived. No amendment to the bill shall
21 be in order except those printed in the report of the Com-
22 mittee on Rules accompanying this resolution. Each such

1 amendment may be offered only in the order printed in
2 the report, may be offered only by a Member designated
3 in the report, shall be considered as read, shall be debat-
4 able for the time specified in the report equally divided
5 and controlled by the proponent and an opponent, shall
6 not be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to
7 a demand for division of the question in the House or in
8 the Committee of the Whole. All points of order against
9 such amendments are waived. At the conclusion of consid-
10 eration of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise
11 and report the bill to the House with such amendments
12 as may have been adopted. The previous question shall
13 be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments
14 thereto to final passage without intervening motion except
15 one motion to recommit.

16 SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
17 in order to consider in the House the bill (S. 5) to require
18 the Secretary of Homeland Security to take into custody
19 aliens who have been charged in the United States with
20 theft, and for other purposes. All points of order against
21 consideration of the bill are waived. The bill shall be con-
22 sidered as read. All points of order against provisions in
23 the bill are waived. The previous question shall be consid-
24 ered as ordered on the bill and on any amendment thereto
25 to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one

1 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair
2 and ranking minority member of the Committee on the
3 Judiciary or their respective designees; and (2) one motion
4 to commit.
