3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Continued Rapid Ohia

5 Death Response Act of 2025".

6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

7 In this Act:

1 (1) RAPID OHIA DEATH.—The term "Rapid 2 Ohia Death" means the disease caused by the fungal 3 pathogen known as Ceratocystis fimbriata that af-4 fects the tree of the species Metrosideros 5 polymorpha.

6 (2) STATE.—The term "State" means the State
7 of Hawaii.

8 SEC. 3. COLLABORATION.

9 The Secretary of the Interior shall partner and col10 laborate with the Secretary of Agriculture and the State
11 to address Rapid Ohia Death.

12 SEC. 4. SUSTAINED EFFORTS.

(a) TRANSMISSION.—The Secretary of the Interior,
acting through the Director of the United States Geological Survey, and the Chief of the Forest Service, acting
through the Forest Service Institute of Pacific Islands
Forestry, shall continue to conduct research on Rapid
Ohia Death vectors and transmission.

(b) UNGULATE MANAGEMENT.—The Secretary of the
Interior, acting through the Director of the United States
Fish and Wildlife Service, shall continue to partner with
the Secretary of Agriculture, the State, and with local
stakeholders to manage ungulates in Rapid Ohia Death
control areas on Federal, State, and private land, with the
consent of private landowners.

(c) RESTORATION AND RESEARCH.—The Secretary 1 of Agriculture, acting through the Chief of the Forest 2 3 Service, shall continue to provide— 4 financial assistance, including through (1)agreements with the Secretary of the Interior-5 (A) to prevent the spread of Rapid Ohia 6 Death; and 7 8 (B) to restore the native forests of the State; and 9 (2) staff and necessary infrastructure funding 10 11 to the Institute of Pacific Islands Forestry to conduct research on Rapid Ohia Death. 12
