RESOLUTION

1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it 2 shall be in order to consider in the House the joint resolu-3 tion (H.J. Res. 25) providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, 4 5 of the rule submitted by the Internal Revenue Service relating to "Gross Proceeds Reporting by Brokers That 6 7 Regularly Provide Services Effectuating Digital Asset 8 Sales". All points of order against consideration of the 9 joint resolution are waived. The joint resolution shall be 10 considered as read. All points of order against provisions 11 in the joint resolution are waived. The previous question 12 shall be considered as ordered on the joint resolution and 13 on any amendment thereto to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally di-14 vided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority 15 16 member of the Committee on Ways and Means or their 17 respective designees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

18 SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
19 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 1156)
20 to amend the CARES Act to extend the statute of limita-

tions for fraud under certain unemployment programs, 1 2 and for other purposes. All points of order against consid-3 eration of the bill are waived. The amendment in the na-4 ture of a substitute recommended by the Committee on 5 Ways and Means now printed in the bill shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered 6 7 as read. All points of order against provisions in the bill, 8 as amended, are waived. The previous question shall be 9 considered as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any 10 further amendment thereto, to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally di-11 12 vided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority 13 member of the Committee on Ways and Means or their respective designees; and (2) one motion to recommit. 14

15 SEC. 3. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 1968) 16 making further continuing appropriations and other exten-17 18 sions for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025, and 19 for other purposes. All points of order against consider-20ation of the bill are waived. The amendment printed in 21 the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this 22 resolution shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as 23 amended, shall be considered as read. All points of order 24 against provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. The 25 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the

bill, as amended, and on any further amendment thereto,
 to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one
 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair
 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Appro priations or their respective designees; and (2) one motion
 to recommit.

SEC. 4. Each day for the remainder of the first session of the 119th Congress shall not constitute a calendar
day for purposes of section 202 of the National Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C. 1622) with respect to a joint resolution terminating a national emergency declared by the
President on February 1, 2025.
