A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to carry out an information technology system and prioritize certain requirements to manage supply chains for medical facilities of the Department of Veterans Affairs.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "VA Hospital Inventory
- 5 Management System Authorization Act".

1	SEC. 2. MANAGEMENT OF SUPPLY CHAINS FOR MEDICAL
2	FACILITIES OF DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS
3	AFFAIRS.
4	(a) AUTHORIZATION.—The Secretary of Veterans Af-
5	fairs is authorized to—
6	(1) purchase or develop for the Veterans Health
7	Administration a cloud-based information technology
8	system for the management of inventory, including
9	expendable and nonexpendable items; and
10	(2) implement such system.
11	(b) Pilot.—If the Secretary purchases or develops
12	a system under subsection (a), the Secretary shall carry
13	out a pilot program at one Veterans Health Administra-
14	tion facility before implementing the system throughout
15	the Veterans Health Administration. The pilot program
16	shall be designed to determine whether the functions of
17	the system are satisfactory.
18	(c) DEADLINE.—If the Secretary purchases or devel-
19	ops a system under subsection (a), the Secretary shall
20	complete the implementation of the system by not later
21	than three years after the date of the enactment of this
22	Act.
23	(d) Limitation.—The Secretary may not exercise
24	the authority under subsection (a) or subsection (b) until
25	the date on which the Secretary submits to the Commit-

2	and the Senate a report that includes—
3	(1) a comprehensive supply chain strategy to
4	guide enterprise-wide implementation, as rec-

9	(GAO-21-445T; published March 24, 2021), which
10	includes success metrics, a plan for data standard-
11	ization, and staffing models;
12	(2) a cost estimate and implementation sched-
13	ule for the supply chain modernization program of
14	the Department;
15	(3) a comprehensive staffing assessment of the
16	supply chain and information technology moderniza-
17	tion workforces of the Department that includes—
18	(A) monthly staffing gains and losses since
19	October 1, 2022;
20	(B) the current staffing level of each such
21	workforce as of the date of the enactment of
22	this Act; and
23	(C) an estimate of future staffing require-
24	ments for the implementation of the supply

chain modernization program, disaggregated by
each such workforce; and
(4) an independent assessment of the review
carried out by the Secretary with respect to failures
of the supply chain modernization program of the
Department.
SEC. 3. EXTENSION OF CERTAIN LIMITS ON PAYMENTS OF
PENSION.

is amended by striking "November 30, 2031" and insert-
ing "December 31, 2032".
