The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution  
\_\_\_\_, by a record vote of 9 to 3, report the same to the House with the  
recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 5371, the  
Continuing Appropriations and Extensions Act, 2026, under a closed rule.  
The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill.  
The resolution provides that the bill shall be considered as read. The  
resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the bill. The  
resolution provides one hour of general debate equally divided and controlled  
by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on  
Appropriations or their respective designees. The resolution provides for one  
motion to recommit. The resolution further provides for consideration of H.  
Res. 719, Honoring the life and legacy of Charles “Charlie” James Kirk,  
under a closed rule. The resolution provides that upon adoption of this  
resolution it shall be in order without intervention of any point of order to  
consider H. Res. 719. The resolution provides that H. Res. 719 shall be  
considered as read. The resolution provides one hour of general debate  
equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of  
the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform or their respective  
designees. The resolution further provides that Sections 9, 10, and 11 of

House Resolution 707, agreed to September 16, 2025, are each amended by striking “March 31, 2026” and inserting “January 31, 2026”.

#### EXPLANATION OF WAIVERS

The waiver of all points of order against consideration of H.R. 5371 includes:

—Clause 11 of rule XXI, which prohibits consideration of a bill or joint resolution which has not been reported by a committee until such measure has been available to Members, Delegates, and the Resident Commissioner for 72 hours.
