A BILL

To require the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration to conduct a study on drone incursions on wild-fire suppression, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Wildfire Aerial Response*
5 *Safety Act”.*

6 **SEC. 2. STUDY ON DRONE INCURSIONS ON WILDFIRE SUP-**
7 **PRESSION.**

8 *(a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:*

9 *(1) COUNTER-UASSYSTEM; UNMANNED AIRCRAFT*
10 *SYSTEM.—The terms “counter-UAS system” and “un-*
11 *manned aircraft system” have the meanings given*
12 *such terms in section 44801 of title 49, United States*
13 *Code.*

14 *(2) UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM INCURSION.—*
15 *The term “unmanned aircraft system incursion”*
16 *means the operation of an unmanned aircraft system*
17 *within any airspace for which the Administrator of*
18 *the Federal Aviation Administration has issued a*
19 *temporary flight restriction because of a wildfire.*

20 *(b) STUDY REQUIRED.—The Administrator of the Fed-*
21 *eral Aviation Administration, in consultation with the Sec-*
22 *retary of the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture, act-*
23 *ing through the Chief of the Forest Service, shall conduct*
24 *a study on the effects of unmanned aircraft system incur-*
25 *sions on wildfire suppression with respect to land managed*

1 *by the Department of the Interior or the Department of Ag-*
2 *riculture.*

3 (c) *STUDY CONTENTS.*—*In conducting the study re-*
4 *quired under subsection (b), the Administrator shall—*

5 (1) *determine, for each of the 5 most recent cal-*
6 *endar years—*

7 (A) *the number of occurrences in which a*
8 *unmanned aircraft system incursion has inter-*
9 *fered with wildfire suppression; and*

10 (B) *the estimated effect of each occurrence*
11 *described in subparagraph (A) on—*

12 (i) *the length of time required to*
13 *achieve complete suppression;*

14 (ii) *any associated delay in the field-*
15 *ing of aerial firefighting response units; and*

16 (iii) *the amounts expended by the Fed-*
17 *eral Government; and*

18 (2) *evaluate the feasibility and effectiveness of—*

19 (A) *the dissemination of educational mate-*
20 *rials relating to the effects of unmanned aircraft*
21 *system incursions on wildfire suppression oper-*
22 *ations; and*

23 (B) *the deployment of approved counter-*
24 *UAS systems by authorized entities as a means*

1 to detect, mitigate, and prevent unmanned air-
2 craft system incursions during such operations.

3 (d) *REPORT.*—Not later than 18 months after the date
4 of enactment of this Act, the Administrator shall submit
5 to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources, the
6 Committee on Appropriations, and the Committee on Com-
7 merce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate and the
8 Committee on Natural Resources, the Committee on Appro-
9 priations, and the Committee on Transportation and Infra-
10 structure of the House of Representatives a report describ-
11 ing—

12 (1) the findings of the study required under sub-
13 section (b); and

14 (2) any recommendations relating to those find-
15 ings.
