RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1501) to amend the FAST Act to include certain mineral production activities as a covered project, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 9436) to

1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.
3 1501) to amend the FAST Act to include certain mineral
4 production activities as a covered project, and for other
5 purposes. All points of order against consideration of the
6 bill are waived. The amendment in the nature of a sub-
7 stitute recommended by the Committee on Natural Re-
8 sources now printed in the bill shall be considered as
9 adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered as read.
10 All points of order against provisions in the bill, as amend-
11 ed, are waived. The previous question shall be considered
12 as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any further
13 amendment thereto, to final passage without intervening

1 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and
2 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of
3 the Committee on Natural Resources or their respective
4 designees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

5 SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
6 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 9436)
7 to amend the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023 to
8 extend the time period for which certain regulations con-
9 cerning the North Atlantic right whale are effective. All
10 points of order against consideration of the bill are waived.
11 In lieu of the amendment in the nature of a substitute
12 recommended by the Committee on Natural Resources
13 now printed in the bill, an amendment in the nature of
14 a substitute consisting of the text of Rules Committee
15 Print 119–40 shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as
16 amended, shall be considered as read. All points of order
17 against provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. The
18 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the
19 bill, as amended, and on any further amendment thereto,
20 to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one
21 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair
22 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Nat-
23 ural Resources or their respective designees; and (2) one
24 motion to recommit.

1 SEC. 3. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
2 in order without intervention of any point of order to con-
3 sider in the House the resolution (H. Res. 1490) providing
4 for the condemnation and denouncement of socialism in
5 all its forms, and for other purposes. The resolution shall
6 be considered as read. The previous question shall be con-
7 sidered as ordered on the resolution and preamble to adop-
8 tion without intervening motion or demand for division of
9 the question except one hour of debate equally divided and
10 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of
11 the Committee on House Administration or their respec-
12 tive designees.

13 SEC. 4. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
14 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 4795)
15 to amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to prohibit
16 an institution that participates in a nonexpressive com-
17 mercial boycott of Israel from being eligible for certain
18 funds under that Act, to require an institution that par-
19 ticipates in certain programs under that Act to certify that
20 students are not unreasonably obstructed from partici-
21 pating in academic programs in Israel, and for other pur-
22 poses. All points of order against consideration of the bill
23 are waived. In lieu of the amendment in the nature of a
24 substitute recommended by the Committee on Education
25 and Workforce now printed in the bill, an amendment in

1 the nature of a substitute consisting of the text of Rules
2 Committee Print 119–39 shall be considered as adopted.
3 The bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. All
4 points of order against provisions in the bill, as amended,
5 are waived. The previous question shall be considered as
6 ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any further
7 amendment thereto, to final passage without intervening
8 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and
9 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of
10 the Committee on Education and Workforce or their re-
11 spective designees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

12 SEC. 5. Debate on motions that the House suspend
13 the rules, under clause 1 of rule XV, relating to the joint
14 resolution (H.J. Res. 1) proposing an amendment to the
15 Constitution of the United States to require that the Su-
16 preme Court of the United States be composed of nine
17 justices, shall be extended to one hour.
