Mr. WILSON of South Carolina introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Education and Workforce

A BILL

To amend the Labor-Management Reporting and Disclosure Act of 1959 to provide that individuals who have been convicted of sex offenses against minors may not serve in certain positions.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Ending Predator Ac-
5 cess to Union Power Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON HOLDING OFFICE.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 504(a) of the Labor-Man-
3 agement Reporting and Disclosure Act of 1959 (29 U.S.C.
4 504(a)) is amended by inserting after “grievous bodily in-
5 jury,” the following: “a sex offense against a minor,”.

6 (b) TECHNICAL AMENDMENT.—Section 504(a) of
7 such Act is further amended by striking “Act any” and
8 inserting “Act, any”.

9 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
10 this Act shall take effect 30 days after the date of enact-
11 ment of this Act.
