**Biographical Sketch**

Dr. Eduardo Ochoa is both a pediatrician and an advocate in the emergent Latino community of Arkansas. He is a Fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) and a tenured Associate Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences (UAMS). Ochoa practices general pediatrics at Arkansas Children's Hospital (ACH) in Little Rock, is Section Chief of Community Pediatrics for the UAMS Department of Pediatrics and is an alumnus of the Open Society Institute's Soros Advocacy Fellowship for Physicians. He received his AB in Religion from Princeton University and his MD from Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center. He began the Latino Clinic for special needs children at ACH in May 2009, the West Little Rock Hispanic Clinic in 2010 and is the past President of the Arkansas Chapter of the AAP. His professional interests include child health disparities and community engagement.
