

Ned Coe is a lifelong Northern California cattle rancher, agricultural advocate, and Modoc County Supervisor. First elected as the District 1 County Supervisor in 2018, he was recently reelected to his third four-year term, which begins in 2027. Coe graduated from California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo in 1980 with a Bachelor of Science in Animal Science and additionally studied Forage and Range Management at Lincoln University in New Zealand.

For the past 25 years, Coe has served as a Field Representative for the California Farm Bureau, specializing in livestock, forestry, water, land use, and predator issues. Prior to this role, he spent 20 years in volunteer leadership positions within the Farm Bureau, including a tenure on the California Farm Bureau Board of Directors.

As a Modoc County Supervisor, Coe has served as Chair of the Board twice. He also represents Modoc County on the California State Association of Counties (CSAC) Board of Directors and the National Association of Counties (NACo). Most recently, Coe was elected Second Vice President of the Western Interstate Region (WIR).
